## Report of the Trustees for the year ending 31st March 2019

The Charity was formed on the 1st October 2015 and started trading on the 1st April 2016 by inheriting the assets of the old charity (No:256085). This new charity is registered with the charity commission and was also formerly known as Advocacy Alliance.

#### **OBJECTIVES OF THE CHARITY**

The objects of Advocacy Alliance are to promote, assist and develop the representation of all people in need of such help by virtue of their age, mental health, physical or learning disability in Scarborough, Whitby, Ryedale, and Filey (hereinafter referred to as the area of benefit); to help them overcome any disadvantage that flows from their personal circumstances, by the provision of a service designed to:-

i) assist the above people to obtain their rights and privileges as a citizen

- ii) provide friendship and support; and
- iii) provide support on a one to one basis to the above people in the area of benefit, whether living in residential care or residing independently in their own home or with relatives.

## **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

#### **Activities**

The activities of the charity are summarised in the Statement of Financial Activities (page 5) which shows an overall surplus during the year of £10,938. However, this includes the net receipts for money to be spent on restricted projects during 2019/20 and would therefore show a true surplus on unrestricted funds of £2,448. The amount of freely available funds for future expenditure of the Charity now stands at £13,542 with a further £58,170 set aside to cover projects already commissioned but not completed.

The further £60,000 of designated funds for the provision of any possible future closure costs etc, remains unchanged in the year.

## **Reserves Policy**

The trustees consider that the cash reserves of the charity should be at least equivalent to the total of six months operating expenses and redundancies costs to allow for downturns in the grant and revenue income. The current situation as at 31st March 2019 is in excess of this figure.

## Report of the Trustees (continued) for the year ending 31st March 2019

#### TRUSTEES' REPORT for 2018/19.

The financial year 1st April 2018 to 31st March 2019 saw Advocacy Alliance's Trustee Board building on the work that the organisation had completed in the previous financial year. The organisation was successful in getting further Police and Crime Commissioner's Community Funding to deliver the SToP Safeguarding training for vulnerable people across North Yorkshire. This was an excellent opportunity for the organisation to raise awareness of the need for vulnerable people to have access to information about how to safeguard themselves. Over the course of the financial year over 500 people attended the training - which was delivered across North Yorkshire including York, Scarborough, Harrogate, Selby and Skipton.

An exciting new development for the organisation was a Silent Art Auction that was held at Woodend on 6th December 2018. A silent auction is an opportunity for people to bid what they can afford on art that has been donated. As Advocacy Alliance is committed to equality between people it was agreed that donations would be sought from professional artists, advocates, clients and anyone else who wanted to support the organisation. We eventually received over 100 donations of art for the Auction. On the day we had excellent support and guidance from our patron Shirley Vauvelle to enable us to display the art works to the best effect. Many new people who had previously not heard of Advocacy Alliance attended the event and we received many positive comments about how well the works were set up and complimenting us on the range of art available.

The Trustee Board had decided that this year was a year for raising awareness of Advocacy Alliance, so they commissioned a video to be produced by Andy Hylton - a film maker with close ties to the area. The filming of the video took place at the end of August and involved staff, trustees and clients driving on an open top bus through Scarborough and Ryedale. A fun day out was had by all, although there were some complaints about the cold. Unfortunately, due to technical issues the video is still in production and will be launched in 2019/20.

Another way in which we have raised our profile is through offering student placements through Scarborough 6th Form and Coventry University. These have been an excellent opportunity for us to raise awareness of the organisation, as we have had students from social care courses who are then able to tell their friends and colleagues about the excellent placement they have had with us. The students also leave the placement with a better understanding of what advocacy is and

In November we were successful in getting "# iwill" funding for a volunteer co-ordinator to help develop policies and procedures that would enable us to recruit younger volunteers. The coordinator has also developed new volunteering opportunities rather than simply just being a volunteer advocate or trustee board member. The new policies and procedures will be presented to the Board for their approval in the financial year 2019/20.

Again building on the theme of raising the organisation's profile, we have been successful in gaining funding from the Tesco Bags for Help scheme to run a number of Advocacy Café's in Filey. These began in February and will continue throughout the year.

#### **RESPONSIBILTIES OF THE TRUSTEES**

The Charities Act 2011 requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit for that period.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is in-appropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with Charities Act 2011. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

## Notes to the financial statements for the year ending 31st March 2019

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### **Basis of accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities".

#### **Fund accounting**

Separate restricted funds are maintained for receipts and payments and also designated funds for specific projects as specified by the source of the funds. The General Fund is maintained to account for all monies received which are not restricted and this fund is used at the discretion of the trustees.

#### Resources expended

Payments are recognised as they are paid by the charity and the expenditure includes the VAT that cannot be recovered. Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of the charitable trading.

All of the Charity's operations are classed as continuing.

There are no recognised gains or losses other than those stated above.
