Summary of the purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document	Para 1.17	To restore, preserve, maintain and display the Edward Birkbeck, Winterton No. 1 Lifeboat 1896-1925, being of historical and constructional merit and accepted onto the National Historic Ships Register under number 2739 and to advance the education of the public in all aspects of its construction and use for public benefit, in particular but not exclusively, the provision and maintenance of a heritage centre.
Summary of the main activities in relation to those purposes for the public benefit, in particular, the activities, projects or services identified in the accounts.	Para 1.17 and 1.19	The Edward Birkbeck remains housed on private land in the grounds of the local Mencap Residential Home within a purpose-made Boat Shelter purchased and constructed in 2016. Unlimited public access is, therefore, unfortunately not possible at present. However, with the agreement of Mencap's site management, we continue to hold Open Days, offering visitors the opportunity to see the Edward Birkbeck and us to tell them about her history, her importance and the work of the Charity to preserve and restore her and our plans to create a Heritage Centre in the village to tell "The Winterton Story" with the Edward Birkbeck as its centrepiece. We also joined with other groups in the village with a stand and display, explaining to visitors both from the village and further afield what the Group is all about; what we're doing and why

Statement confirming whether the trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit	Para 1.18	Within the constraints noted above regarding the current location of the Edward Birkbeck, we are also able to arrange for interested individuals and small groups to visit the Boat Shelter on other occasions. This is subject to agreement from all parties and is always accompanied by a Trustee or Volunteer who can give appropriate information and answer questions. We welcome new volunteers – of all ages and abilities - who receive guidance and training from our Project Manager (a Master Boatbuilder with many years' experience) and work alongside other volunteers. Regular Restoration Work Parties take place most weekends. The Trustees continue to ensure that the activities of Winterton on Sea Lifeboat Restoration Group are reported via social media and on our website.

Para 1.20	Following the news of the refusal of our Planning Application, we were delighted to be invited to talk to the Consortium now operating the Village School who are planning to create a residential Field Studies Centre within underused space in the school buildings and who felt that our planned Heritage Centre would be a great asset to that. They are currently awaiting Planning Permission for this work and will then apply to the Secretary of State for Education on our behalf to site a small building in the corner of their school playing field which will become our Heritage Centre — "The Winterton Story". We plan to seek Grant Funding to raise the money to install and fit-out this building and then the Edward Birkbeck will be moved to the new building as the restoration work moves forward. "The Winterton Story" Heritage Centre will tell its visitors about the maritime, social and natural history of Winterton and its coastline and unique Dunes system. We believe it will become a valuable resource for the village, telling the story of Winterton from earliest times right up to modern times as a popular destination for day trippers and holiday makers. Also, for the many visitors who, when researching their family history, have discovered Winterton descendants who were involved in fishing and lifeboats and want to know more about their lives.
