Report of the trustees for the year ended 31 January 2019

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 January 2019. The trustees who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1.

Structure, governance and management

The Charity is governed by its constitution. Appointment of trustees is made in accordance with the constitution. The trustees meet monthly to manage the Charity's affairs.

Objectives and activities

The Charity is committed to enabling as many people as possible to worship at our Church and to become part of our Church community at Emmanuel Baptist Church.

When planning out activities for the year, the Pastor and trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and, in particular, specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion.

Achievements and performance

The Charity is keen to offer a range of services that our community find both beneficial and spiritually fulfilling. We have continued to support our chosen missionaries during the year.

Financial review

The accounts show a net deficit for the year of (£11,922) and our unrestricted funds total £138,118 at 31 January 2019. Income has been maintained at a level to enable us to continue to support our missionaries.

Reserves policy

The Charity has reserves which are utilised in maintaining the current activities of the Church. The trustees consider that the level of reserves held is adequate to continue the current activities of the Church.

Plans for future periods

The trustees intend to continue to support missionaries.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the charity for that year. In preparing these financial statements the trustees are required to:


- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently; observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;

Independent examiner's report to the trustees on the accounts of Emmanuel Baptist Church

I report on the accounts of Emmanuel Baptist Church for the year ended 31 January 2019 set out on pages 2 to 6.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and independent examiner

As the charity's trustees you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts, you consider that the audit requirement of section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 (the Act) does not apply and that an independent examination is needed. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts under The Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 (SI 2008 No. 629), to follow the procedures laid down in the CC32 Independent Examination of Charity Accounts: Examiners' Guide, and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.
