Our screenings will be at the Amstelveen and Rialto cinemas in Amsterdam, the Lumiere in Maastricht, and the Louis Hartlooper Complex in Utrecht.

At SERET International, we have enjoyed great success in bringing the best of Israeli feature films, documentaries, shorts and TV to the UK over the past seven years, one year for every decade of Israel's existence, and we have expanded with Festivals in Amsterdam, Amstelveen and Maastricht in the Netherlands, Cologne, Munich and Berlin in Germany, Santiago and Valparaiso in Chile, and considerations are being given to extending the Festival to the USA this year with screenings planned for Boston.

#### 1. General information
