The programme of events for the year was ambitious. The major fund raisers were the Christmas and Summer Fayres. In addition, we held a big Cycle Ride event, a New Parents Evening, Spotlight, talent evening Quiz Night, School Discos, Cake Sales and an Art Show. Although not all of these events are primarily aimed at fund raising, we were able to ensure that all events made at least a small profit. We were also able to ensure access for all by keeping entry fees to a minimum using local sponsorship to support this. All of the events were well supported by staff and families.
