## Trustees' Report for the Year Ended 28th February 2019

The trustees present their annual report and unaudited accounts for the Year Ended 28<sup>th</sup> February 2019 and confirm they comply with the Charities Act 1993, as amended by the Charities Act 2006, the trust deed and the Charities SORP 2005.

#### Objects & Activities for the Public Benefit

Objectives & Aims: -

1) The relief of financial need and suffering among victims of natural or other kinds of disaster in the form of money (or other means deemed suitable) for persons, bodies, organisations and/or countries affected [including the provision of medical aid, food aid, shelter etc.].

2) The relief and assistance of people in any part of the world who are victims of war or natural disaster, trouble, or catastrophe in particular by the supply of medical & food aid to such persons.

#### Activities & Achievements: -

The objects of the charity were carried out and achieved by the following;

Projects in Syria:

- The first project: The project of (Warm Winter), the distribution of the Heating fuel to the poor, orphans and displaced families 50 litres per family The total beneficiaries: 222 families. The total budget: €7229.07 The geographical range: Binnish city and its suburbs Jan 2018
- The second project: Distributing NFI winter needs (pillow-sponge mattress-double blanket) to the displaced families from Eastern Ghouta Number of beneficiaries 55 families. The total budget: €3209. The geographical range: Binnish city and its nearby farms -Feb 2018
- The third project; Distributing Food Packs to Displaced families from Ghouta who resided in Binnish -160 families Food Packs contents (wheat-rice -oil-sugar-tea-spaghetti-beans-sweetness-lentils-coffee-tomato molasses -jam-canned meat-salt-cheese -potato) The total budget: €6692.80 The geographical range: Binnish city March 2018
- The Fourth project: Distributing Kitchen equipment (Gas jar -ground gas stove Kitchen utensils). The targeted people are also displaced Ghouta families in Binnish city -64 families. Total budget: €3400- Binnish and its farms -April 2018
- The fifth project: Distributing lightening devices to the displaced families from Ghouta. Kit contents (effortless- charging organizer -solar panel -battery) Number of distributed kits 25 Total Budget €5022.5 Binnish and its suburbs -April 2018

- The sixth project: Distributing Kitchen Utensil Packs to displaced Ghouta families (teapot -water bottles -water barrel, dish-spoons-plates-knives-coffee pot-tea glasses -cubs -broom-axe-wiper)
  Number of distributed packs 204 Total budget: €5584,48 Binnish and its farms -April 2018
- The seventh project: Distributing Ramadhan Packs to the widows, orphans and poor families in Binnish and its surrounding areas. the Packs included: (peas -grit potato -dates -cheese -sweetness-tomato molasses -rice −oil sugar-tea-flour-etc) Number of distributed packs: 300 Total budget: €9586,80 Binnish and its surrounding areas May -2018
- The eighth project: Distributing tents to the displaced families from the eastern countryside of Hama and the southern countryside of Aleppo who are Bedouin and they are adapted to live in tents Number of beneficiaries are 43 families Total budget €6265,53 Binnish and its farms June 2018
- The ninth project: Distributing Food Packs to the lonely poor widows and the displaced families in Binnish city. The Packs contents: (peas -Broats -potato-dates-rice -sugar-flour-tea-olive oil) Number of beneficiaries are : 300 families Total budget : €10184,86 Binnish June 2018
- The tenth project: Eid Sacrifices We slaughtered 77 sheep's each sheep weighs nearly 51 kilograms and its price is approx €147. Number of beneficiaries: 1145 families from the displaced, widows, orphans and the poor families in Binnish and its surrounding areas. Total budget: €11371.39 Binnish Eid ul Adha 2018
- The eleventh project: Distributing Orphans Sponsorship Grants during 2018 Number of orphans 150 The sum is €150 for each orphan every three months. Total budget: €22500. This project was implemented in Binnish and surrounding areas during 2018 through three stages as the following: 50 orphans in March 2018 50 orphans in June 2018 50 orphans in September 2018
- The twelfth project: Supporting the bread distribution project in order to be distributed for free to the displaced needy families, where we supplied Binnish First Oven by the fuel as the following: Fuel quantity: 504 litres and then the oven distributed 9000 baked bread for free and each baked bread weighs 1150 g. Number of the beneficiaries: 346 families

Project duration 26 days (the number of actual working days in the oven per month) Total budget: €3878 - Binnish and surrounding areas- November 2018

#### Projects in Djibouti:

Ramadhan Food Packs and Iftar Meals distribution to the most needy families during the month of Ramadhan. May 2018 - £2000

Udhiyyah / Qurbani Project in the days of Eid ul Adha and the meat distributed to the most needy in the days of Eid. Sep 2018 - £295

#### **Projects in Yemen:**

Ramadhan Food Packs and Iftar Meals distribution to the most needy families during the month of Ramadhan. May 2018 - £2000

Udhiyyah / Qurbani Project in the days of Eid ul Adha and the meat distributed to the most needy in the days of Eid. Sep 2018 - £450
