Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The principle objects of the charity are:

- to advance the Christian faith,
- to relieve sickness and financial hardship and to promote and preserve good health, and
- to advance education

The trustees and director teams follow a principle objective of the proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and in addition provide a facility for people to meet to worship and praise God, to stand alongside people as they grow as individual Christians, and to encourage fellowship.

Public benefit

The trustees confirm that they have paid due regard to Charity Commission guidance on public benefit in deciding what activities to undertake and are described below.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Local mission's community activities

Amblecote Christian Centre continues to focus its activities on the local community. The range of community related activities includes ongoing clubs for different parts of the community, support for local individuals and families, and working with several local schools.

The work of the Brierley Hill Project remains largely unchanged. Activities continue to focus on the Hawbush area via the Community Garden project, and our Church Children's worker who runs several family events throughout the year.

The church continues to support the school's initiative called Transforming Lives for Good (TLG) which enables members of our congregation to go into local primary schools, with a large percentage maintaining their commitment to Hawbush Primary School to mentor some of the children that are encountering challenges. We are also continuing to provide family afternoons during the school holidays. Strong links have been maintained with the charity called Safe Families for Children who support local families through volunteers who sign up to be 'Family Friends', Resource Friends' and 'Host Families'. A number of our church family have continued to support the charity as volunteers, and we continue to promote both TLG and Safe Families for Children on a regular basis.

Supporting work in the Dudley Borough & Nationally

Members of the staff and volunteers continue to be involved in wider Dudley Borough activities including The Black Country Foodbank, Leaders Networks, Charity and Voluntary sector, and representation on statutory sector partnership working groups. Staff Members are also heavily involved in Love Black Country (The Black Country NET), a network that works to unite the Church of the Black Country in support & mission.

The church continues to develop its support and partnership with British Youth For Christ (YFC) teams and their involvement in schools and youth events on a national basis. YFC use our building regularly for their national team meetings and the Year Out Programme. Young people in one of the YFC teams incorporating the touring band and dance group are hosted by several families in our Church family.

International mission activities

Our support, primarily in the form of one off and regular financial gifts, for mission activity overseas continues. Our work with partners in Thailand, Kenya and Romania continued during the year. Our robust review of giving and support for international mission is ongoing as we look to be diligent and form firmer partnerships.

Representing our faith community politically

We are still actively involved in ensuring our faith communities' views are heard and valued at a local and national political level, as this is one of our core values.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The deficit of income over expenditure for the year amounted to $\pounds(56,861)$ (2018: ($\pounds47,795$)).

The unrestricted funds totalling £596,701 (2018: £651,055) and restricted funds of £15,928 (2018: £18,435), gave an overall funds total of £612,629 (2018: £669,490).

Principal funding sources

The vast majority of the finances required to fund the activities were raised through regular giving and one off donations from church members, supplemented by the refund of income tax from HM Revenue & Customs through the Gift Aid scheme.

Reserves policy

The ACC Reserves policy has two main objectives:

1) To ensure that there are adequate buffer funds to allow ACC operations to continue in the short term in the event that its income stream is unexpectedly interrupted. Ordinarily ACC will aim to retain approximately £25,000 in accessible reserves. The Directors may agree to permanently or temporarily suspend this level as necessary.

2) To generate sufficient funds to allow investments that secure ACC operations into the future. Any amounts over the agreed of buffer funds will be available for investments, which are intended to maintain and develop ACC operations. All investments with be consistent with ACC values.

The amount of unrestricted reserves not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets (the 'free' reserves) held at 31 March 2019 was £91,066 (2018 £127,763)

Restricted funds are disclosed in note 11

FUTURE PLANS

Church leadership

The church has continued to follow a revised leadership structure based on a shared leadership model and this is reviewed and tweaked accordingly during the year.

Administrative support function changes

The planned recruitment of a communications worker took place during the year.

New developments

The church is planning to add a new role to the operational / ministry team. The role will focus on leading the worship team and managing a future internship programme. The church is also planning to provide study and financial support for our childrens and family worker to do a theology degree.

Building and maintenance

The church is continuing with the building and improvement works that began in the recent years. The planned works in the main reception area were completed during the year. Works to the main hall are still planned but have not yet been completed.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Amblecote Community Church is a company limited by guarantee not having a share capital, operating under a Memorandum and Articles of Association. It was incorporated on 1 September 2009, registration number 07005276. The company was registered as a charity on 11 November 2009, registration number 1132641. The charity operates under the name of Amblecote Christian Centre. The directors of the company are also the trustees of the charity.

Organisational structure

New Trustees/Directors are appointed by existing Trustees/Directors. They schedule to meet on a regular basis throughout the year and undertake the general administration and management of the Charity. They collectively practice good governance, making informed decisions based on the Charity's objectives. The Board of Trustees/Directors aim to have a broad range of business skills represented, but in particular Christian doctrine, finance and law.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property	- 2% on cost
Furniture and equipment	- 10% on cost
Fixtures and fittings	- 25% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
