ANNUAL REPORT TO THE CHARITY COMMISSIONERS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) including the rector, team vicars and other support staff promoted the whole mission of the Church in the ecclesiastical parish.

The Parish of Dunstable is responsible for and comprises the PCC, three District Church Councils (DCC's) of the Priory Church of St Peter, St Augustine of Canterbury and St Fremund the Martyr. There was also a Local Ecumenical Partnership (LEP) with St Katherine of Genoa United Reformed Church (URC) which is still continuing.

The PCC held four meetings during the year at St Katherine of Genoa URC and St Augustine's Church. There were a further four meetings of the Standing/Finance Committee all held at the administrative offices at Chew's House, 77 High Street South, Dunstable. The Annual Parish Church Meeting was held on 26 April 2018 at the Church of St Fremund the Martyr to approve the accounts and various reports for 2017 together with elections of PCC members.

The ordained staff was led by the Team Rector the Rev'd Canon Richard Andrews with supporting Team Vicars the Rev'd Ricky Turner, Rev'd Tim Davis and Parish Readers Mrs Vanessa Bradley and Dr. Johan Schoeman. The Rector Rev'd Canon Richard Andrews left the Parish after his last service on 19 August 2018 to take up a position as Rev'd Canon for Liturgy at Derby Cathedral. The position of rector has remained vacant to date. The Rev'd Tim Davis was licensed as Team Vicar of the Church of St Fremund the Martyr on 29 October 2018 following a vacancy period when the Rev'd Lynn Money left the Parish on 31 December 2017. Chaplaincy services were provided to two local school academies during November and December 2018 as part of the Rev'd Tim Davis's duties. This arrangement continues for the future and will help towards meeting the Diocesan quota levied on the Parish.

The PCC worked to support as many people as possible to worship at our churches and to become part of the Parish community in Dunstable. The PCC maintained an overview of worship throughout the Parish and looked to improve on how our services could involve the many communities and groups that live within the Parish. Our services and worship put faith into practice through prayer, scripture, music and sacrament.

When planning activities the PCC considered the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit and in particular the guidance on charities seeking the advancement of religion. In particular the PCC tried to help ordinary people to live out their faith as part of our Parish community with activity that addressed this need through:

- Worship and prayer
- Pastoral care and support for people living in the Parish
- · Missionary and outreach work

To facilitate the activities, it was/is important to maintain the fabric of the Church buildings and premises that we have responsibility for. A substantial amount of energy was directed towards improving the welcome and facilities the parish offers to the wider community for whom we care and support through good and difficult life times.

As PCC Treasurer I co-ordinate the volunteer treasurers of the three DCC's and to ensure the financial records are maintained for the preparation of annual accounts for the churches and consequently the consolidated accounts for the Parish. The PCC engaged in the oversight of Mission Action Planning, safeguarding and health and safety which ensured that good standards were maintained. PCC meetings received reports and information on activity items including Deanery Synod, Dunstable Churches Together, Dunstable Street Pastors and Dunstable Foodbank. Subjects included:

The visit of the Bishop of Bedford

Schools, academies and their premises

Property maintenance/alterations/improvements including twelfth century heritage for the Priory Church of St Peter

Choir leadership

Many adults and children attending regular activities are encouraged to join the Parish Electoral Roll and vote for Churchwardens and officers of the PCC and DCC's. In 2018 there were 324 people registered on the Electoral Roll and 116 planned gift aided donors contributing towards the cost of running the Church and charitable activities.

Financial review for 2018

The net assets of the Parish increased by £12,316 to £806,643 (2017: £794,327).

Total income of all funds for the year was £284,898 which fell by £107,508 from 2017's total of £392,406. This was mainly due to legacies received in 2017 of £152,247 as opposed to £16,200 for 2018.

Total expenditure of all funds for the year was £271,302 a reduction of £27,854 from 2017's total. This was in large part due to a reduction of £25,835 in church maintenance costs.

Of the total income, income for unrestricted funds was £247,992 of which £156,473 came from voluntary income including planned giving of gift aid donations, income tax recoverable, other planned giving, sundry donations and legacies. Church activities including hall lettings and fees received for weddings and funerals brought in £44,109. Fund raising totalled £13,832 and rental income from the freehold property was £12,373.

Expenditure on unrestricted funds was £257,444 of which the major cost was £139,060 being the Parish's quota contribution to the Diocese of St Albans. Other expenditure incurred includes £26,555

for Staff Costs, £33,963 for church running, maintenance and upkeep of services and £28,931 for church halls' running/maintenance costs.

Restricted funds income of £35,527 benefited included a £15,000 legacy for future major church hall and garage maintenance.

Net movement on funds for the Parish is summarised as follows:

Unrestricted Funds net expenditure £ (9,268)

Restricted Funds net income £ 22,600

Endowment Funds net loss £ (1,016)

Total Net Income £ 12,316

Reserves carried forward at 31 December 2018 for unrestricted funds for general purposes were £681,653 of which £49,773 had been allocated for designated funds leaving a net balance of £631,880 Fixed assets account for £328,215 of this leaving net current assets of £303,665. It should be noted that fixed assets include a current selling valuation of £320,000 for the clergy house at 95 Evelyn Road, Dunstable which was rented out during 2018.

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2018 set out on pages two to fifteen.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the year ending 31 December 2018

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The PCC is a public benefit entity within the meaning of FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011 and in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 governing the individual accounts of PCCs, and with the Regulations' 'true and fair view' provisions, together with FRS102 (2016) as the applicable accounting standards and the 2016 version of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by charities and applicable accounting standards (SORP) (FRS102)).

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for investment assets, which are shown at market value. The financial statements include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which the PCC is responsible in law. They do not include the accounts of church groups that owe their main affiliation to another body, nor those that are informal gatherings of church members.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are general funds which are to be spent on the PCC's ordinary purposes.

Designated funds are general funds set aside by the PCC for use in the future. Project funds are designated for particular projects for administrative purposes only. Designated funds remain unrestricted and the PCC will move any surplus to other general funds.

Restricted funds comprise (a) income from endowments which is to be expended only on the restricted purpose intended by the donor, and (b) revenue donations or grants for a specific PCC activity intended by the donor. Where these funds have unspent balances, interest on their pooled investment is apportioned to the individual funds on an average balance basis.

Endowment funds are funds, the capital of which must be retained either permanently or at the PCC's discretion; the income derived from the endowment is to be used either as restricted or unrestricted income funds depending upon the purpose for which the endowment was established in the first place.

Income

Planned giving, collections and similar donations are recognised when received. Tax refunds are recognised when the incoming resource to which they relate is received. Grants and legacies are accounted for when the PCC is legally entitled to the amounts due. Interest is accounted for as and when accrued by the payer. All incoming resources are accounted for gross.

Expenditure

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over, or when awarded, if that award creates a binding or constructive obligation on the PCC. The diocesan parish share is accounted for when due. All other expenditure is generally recognised when it is incurred and is accounted for gross.

Fixed Assets

Consecrated and benefice property is not included in the accounts in accordance with s.10(2)(a) and (c) of the Charities Act 2011.

Moveable church furnishings held by the rector and churchwardens on special trust for the PCC and which require a faculty for disposal are inalienable property. Listed in the church's inventory, which can be inspected (at any reasonable time). For anything acquired prior to 2000 there is insufficient cost information available and therefore such assets are not valued in the financial statements.

The PCC adopts the policy of accounting at 'current value' for the clergy house at 95 Evelyn Road, Dunstable. The house which is temporarily let has been revalued at market value 31 December.

Equipment used within the church premises is depreciated on a straight-line basis over four to twenty years. Individual items of equipment with a purchase price of £50 or less are written off when the asset is acquired.

Investments are valued at market value at 31 December 2018

Functional charitable land and buildings are not included in the balance sheet. This comprises the Priory Church Hall which has a valuation of approximately £200,000 (1997). The land was acquired by deed of grant from The Crown Estate in 1839 to be used as a school, and later in 1923 the use was changed to that of church and similar meetings. Should this use change, outside of those permitted by the grants, there would be a right of re-entry to the land registry and The Crown Estate. Therefore no commercial gain would be realised.
