Our quite considerable presence was especially noted and, although I didn't actually count heads, I estimated that our contingent was arguably the largest of the uniformed youth organisations. Well done and thank you to all concerned!

In conclusion, may I once again thank the Local Authority, parents, leaders and all others, including the young people, who have helped carry forward the work of Scouting in this district over the past year.
