	Collections from the boxes are made by the trustees themselves and sent as soon as possible to our agent in Kenya using the services of Western Union. Every penny collected has been sent to Kenya. The trustees make no charge for administration. Indeed, the Western Union fees are found from our own pockets.

Support has been provided to the chicken farm for feed, inoculations and equipment with eggs going into breakfasts for the benefit of children at the Ivuusya Primary School. Charity funds have been used for school building works and for the purchase basic foodstuffs (beans, maize, sugar and salt) and clean drinking water which has to be imported by tanker.

Our agent in Kenya has responsibility for managing the chicken farm, for overseeing building works at the school. in liaison with the head teacher, and for the purchase of food and water. All of the funding is by grant.
