ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TRUSTEE DIRECTORS

YEAR ENDED 31st JANUARY 2019

The trustee directors present their report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st January 2019. Legal and administrative information set out on page 1 forms part of this report.

Constitution and objects

Jubilee Fields Community Association is constituted under memorandum and articles of association dated 20th December 2004 and is a registered charity (Charity Number 1107811). It is limited by guarantee.

The company was registered with the same name and objectives as the original charitable trust (Company Number 05317292). On 26th January 2005, the company was recognised as charitable by the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales (Charity Number 1107811).

The trustee directors at the year end are set out on page 1. No director had a beneficial interest in the company.

Since 31st January 2005, the charitable company has continued the work of the original charitable trust, following the transfer of the trust's asset and liabilities. The original charitable trust was wound up and removed from the Charities Commission register on 14th June 2005.

The company's objectives are to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Jubilee Fields Estate and Shildon Town by associating together the inhabitants and the local authorities, voluntary and other organisations to advance education, social welfare and leisure time occupations, and to establish a community centre for the area.

Organisation

The trustee directors who have served during the period and since the year end are set out on page 1.

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of company law. Under the requirements of the Memorandum and Articles of Association the trustee directors are elected to serve for a period of three years after which they must be re-elected at the next Annual General Meeting.

The charitable company is managed by the board of trustees which comprises not less than three trustees. The opportunity for appointment as a trustee is promoted widely and informal meetings for those who are potentially interested in becoming trustees are undertaken to inform them of the work of the charity and the role and responsibilities of the trustees.

Financial activities and results

Over the last year the Association was successful in obtaining external funding for their small workforce along with ever increasing running costs for the centre to operate. As always we continue to be clearly focused on providing, developing and implementing a wide and varied programme of activities and services for our community which addresses their needs, reduces social isolation and enhances their futures whilst improving employment/voluntary prospects. Once again our focus for the forthcoming year is to continue to obtain further funding enabling us to sustain and build upon our current activities and objectives for the future.

Throughout the year we have continued to maintain our valuable partnership links with the statutory, voluntary, charitable and local organisations to once again maintain Jubilee Fields Community Association's status of being a hub for both child and adult learning. This has helped our community to enhance their knowledge and skills whilst developing personally. During 2018 thanks to a multitude of organisations/funders such as the Big Lottery, livin housing, County Durham Community Foundation, the Scotto Charitable Trust, Durham County Council, Shildon Town Council, Greggs Foundation along with local Councillors we were able to deliver various projects for all ages within the centre. We hope with future external funding to repeat such projects in the future for the residents of Shildon town.

We would like to thank all of the above organisations for their help, funding and guidance over the past year, without whom we would not have been able to provide the activities and support to our residents and the wider community.

Jubilee Fields Community Association has been serving the residents of the Thickley Ward of Shildon and the wider community for the past 18 years and the Centre still continues to grow and be a thriving hub for all ages. We continue to maintain and update our activities along with the offer of help and support to all users of the centre and the community as a whole.

In order to continue sustaining growth, once again our primary aim is to apply for external funding which will enable us to continue the employment of our dedicated part-time staff. With continued succession planning our vision is to retain existing staff, maintain the Centre to a high standard and provide a safe environment for children/young people and their families.

Reserves

The Management Committee consider it prudent to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the charity, at the level of three months of core cost expenditure and redundancy entitlements. The reserves are mainly represented by the actual community centre building, totalling £416,805 to include all fixtures, fittings and equipment. Working capital reserves of £37,860 are considered satisfactory.

Risk Management

An ongoing review process has revealed major funding opportunities available to the company and also any risks to which it is exposed. The Management Committee reviews financial activities regularly, with remedial action taken to compensate for any projected funding shortfall or overspend. Internal risks are minimised by the authorisation procedures in place for all transactions.

Statement of Directors' Responsibilities

UK Company Law requires the directors, who are also trustees, to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of its financial activities for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- a) select suitable accounting policies and the apply them consistently;
- b) make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- c) prepare the Financial Statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the charity will continue operating.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the Financial Statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Small Company Provisions

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31st JANUARY 2019

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of Preparation of Accounts

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. In preparing the financial statements, the charity follows best practice as laid down in the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

1.2 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

1.3 Incoming Resources

Income is accounted for on an accruals basis. Grants are recognised as an incoming resource when the conditions for the receipt have been met and are accounted for in accordance with the terms of the grant.

1.4 Resources Expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Governance costs include the costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity.

1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are capitalised and included at cost including any incidental expenses of acquisition.

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost over their expected useful economic lives as follows:
