Objectives OF The Organization:

Granby Somali Women's Group objective is to increase mainstream services for women from Somali and BME communities located in the Liverpool Ward. The center is a lifeline for a large number of Somali women and families and families from other BME Communities who are unable to access services due to barriers in language.

Granby Somali Women's Group aims to achieve the following outcomes for service users:

- Increase participation in activities, which reduce isolation.
- Improved Access to Service Provision
- Improved Confidence and Self-esteem
- Improved Income and Opportunities
- To reduce the language barrier

Activities offered at the Centre:

- i. Outreach/Support Service: Surgeries providing benefit, housing, health and welfare, education, employment and training awareness.
- ii. Help, Advocacy and advice: Assistance with housing repairs, debt advice, asylum and legal sign positing, budgeting awareness and form filing assistance.
- iii. Elder People Support: Somali Dance workshops and

Volunteering:

- i. Younger Members: Summer Play Schemes, employment & Training Assistance, Selfesteem sessions.
- ii. Open Days/Learning Events: Held in partnership with funders and statutory agencies.



Achievements:

Achievements:

Rosa - Justice & Equality Fund has empowered GSWG to deliver sessions raising awareness regarding sexual harassment and abuse for women from BME Communities, and especially to those who face a language barrier. This project has enabled BME women from the communities that GSWG serves to gain knowledge and understanding, in order to address sexual harassment in the workplace.

Participants involved in this project have been able to enhance their self-confidence and self esteem, despite the multitude of disadvantages' that these women face in the area of deprivation, isolation, language barrier etc.

NHS Liverpool CCG - GSWG was able to conclude its work in this area with its funding from the CCG. Over the last two years with this project GSWG has been able to continue its grassroots work in the area of FGM and move the debate forward to include families affected by this practice. By tackling this issue in a family setting, GSWG has been able to debate the topic with the family as a whole and outline why this practice needs to end.

Liverpool City Council (CRU) - Granby Somali Women's Group with its funding from Liverpool City Council (CRU) has been able to offer a twice weekly drop in befriending service for Muslim women. The aim of the project is to enable Muslim women to feel less isolated and improve their quality of life by interacting with others from within the community. The drop in befriending sessions are targeted at those who are isolated and secluded from mainstream provision and outcomes center on building new friendships, gain knowledge and insight into the range of activities available within the community and how to access them. The women involved are isolated, face a language barrier, and are in desperate need of increasing their confidence and self-esteem.



Workers Educational Association (ESF) — The 'Developing Me' project, was a pre-employment project, funded by the WEA and equipped job seekers to access skills in the sewing industry. This helped to improve current skill sets/work experience, which participants may have never seen as a skill that they can use to find employment. This project reached women in isolation and those who were economically inactive due to barriers in language, had low self-esteem and low self-confidence. Participants were also able to use skills gained on a previous course called 'empowering me', which provided the first opportunity to enter employment via volunteering.

<u>Awards For All (Big Lottery)</u> - GSWG was able to secure funding from Awards for All to deliver sessions for women from BME communities, providing advice, support and advocacy for those who feel isolated due to a language barrier. Over the last eighteen months, the organisation has seen an increase in service users from the BME community due to the closing of numerous services in the Princess Park Ward area. The growth of service users demonstrates the achievements of our grass roots organisation and the continued need for our services.

Skelton Bounty: GSWG was able to secure funding from the Skelton Bounty to purchase items for the brand new kitchen that the Tudor Trust funded. Without this capital funding from the Skelton Bounty, GSWG would not be able to continue with its development of its luncheon club service.

MPAC & Austin Smith: These grant's facilitated activities for young members located in the Princes Park ward over the summer period. A programme of activity was designed and delivered for young people from the BME Communities during the summer holidays of 2018. Activities like playing football, tennis, swimming, nature walks were all part of the programme, enabling young people to get active rather then residing at home or becoming involved in anti-social behaviour.

Challenges for 2020:

Additionally, GSWG will once again be concentrating its funding strategy towards improving the skill set of women who are service users of the centre. Providing these service users with the necessary skills to enter employment or volunteering will be a key plan of the organistation going forth.



Furthermore, assisting children who are excluded and isolated living within the Princes Park ward will also be part of the approach going forward. Enabling these young minds to reach their full potential and become the leaders of tomorrow will be ever present in the design of the charity in the year to come.

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005), applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006. The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements as follow:

Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Tangible Fixed Assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures, Fittings and Equipment

18% on reducing balance

Incoming Resources

Donations and Grants

Income from donation and grants, including capital grants, is included in incoming resources when these are receivable, except as follows:

- -When donors specify that donations and grants given to the charity must be used in future accounting periods, the income is deferred until those periods.
- -When donors impose conditions which have to be fulfilled before the charity becomes entitled to use such income, the income is deferred and not included in incoming resources until the preconditions for use have been met.
- -When donors specify that donations and grants including capital grants, are for particular restricted purposes, which do not amount to pre-conditions regarding entitlement, this income is included in incoming resources of restricted funds when receivable.

Resources Expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accrual basis, inclusive of VAT which cannot be recovered.

Certain expenditure is directly attributable to specific activities and has been included in those cost categories on the basis of an estimate of the proportion of the time spent on those activities.

Taxation

Analysis of the tax charge

No liablility to UK corporation tax arise on ordinary activities for the year Ending 5 April 2018. Income and gains are exempt from taxation as they are applied for charitable purposes only. The charity benefit from various exemptions from taxation afforded by tax legislation and is not liable to corporation tax on income or gains falling within these exemptions. The charity is not able to recover Value Added Tax. Expenditure is recorded in the accounts inclusive of VAT.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Tangible Fixed Assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures, Fittings and Equipment

18% on reducing balance

Incoming Resources

Donations and Grants

Income from donation and grants, including capital grants, is included in incoming resources when these are receivable, except as follows:

- -When donors specify that donations and grants given to the charity must be used in future accounting periods, the income is deferred until those periods.
- -When donors impose conditions which have to be fulfilled before the charity becomes entitled to use such income, the income is deferred and not included in incoming resources until the preconditions for use have been met.
- -When donors specify that donations and grants including capital grants, are for particular restricted purposes, which do not amount to pre-conditions regarding entitlement, this income is included in incoming resources of restricted funds when receivable.

Resources Expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accrual basis, inclusive of VAT which cannot be recovered.

Certain expenditure is directly attributable to specific activities and has been included in those cost categories on the basis of an estimate of the proportion of the time spent on those activities.

Taxation

Analysis of the tax charge

No liablility to UK corporation tax arise on ordinary activities for the year Ending 5 April 2018. Income and gains are exempt from taxation as they are applied for charitable purposes only. The charity benefit from various exemptions from taxation afforded by tax legislation and is not liable to corporation tax on income or gains falling within these exemptions. The charity is not able to recover Value Added Tax. Expenditure is recorded in the accounts inclusive of VAT.
