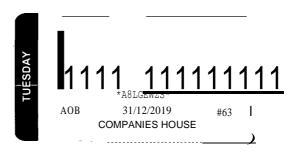

TRUSTEE'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

Structure, governance and management

OSAIS is a charity limited by guarantee and received charitable status in October 2013. It is governed by the Articles of Association last updated in June 2013.

Organisational structure

The Trustees are responsible for the general management of the charity and ensuring that all legal requirements are met. The trustees receive no remuneration or other financial benefits for their services as trustees. The trustees have appointed ACT (Azhari Consultancy & Training) to manage the daily operation of OSAIS. ACT ensures that those that are working for OSAIS are trained and supported to efficiently carry out their quties to meet the objectives set out in the Articles of Association.

OSAIS has set up a management structure, which consists of a management team (Shoora team), School Council, ACT and general volunteers from the student body. OSAIS has an AGM every year. The Trustees have two formal meetings annually. ACT has had several meetings throughout the year with the various teams. All meetings are documented.

Appointment and training of Trustees

Trustees appoint a new trustee by nominating candidates based on their commitment and understanding of the ethos and vision of OSAIS and their availability. OSAIS trustees are committed to ensure that there is an equal representation of male and female trustees. Voting takes place amongst the trustees and they are added according to the majority. Potential trustees are invited as observers to attend trustee meetings to fully understand the role of a trustee and the aims and objectives of OSAIS. Training of trustees is a joint responsibility of ACT, current trustees and the Shoora team.

Objectives

In setting our objectives and planning our activities, the trustees have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit.

- To provide facilities for the provision of Islamic education in Manchester, as well as nationally, for adults.
- To also work on setting up an education structure for young people.
- To set-up and engage in interfaith and community activities to promote and support social cohesion within Manchester.
- To provide and maintain a building used for educational and community purposes in Manchester.
- To engage and support the positive work done by other Muslim institutes and communities who are also working for the betterment of community relations of the wider society in the UK.

Our objectives are set to reflect our educational aims and the ethos of OSAIS. Our objectives, activities and developments are reviewed bi-annually.

TRUSTEE'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

The focus of our work

Academic

OSAIS provides Islamic education to adult Muslims locally through classes based in Old Trafford and nationally via online/conference call facilities. The classes range from foundation level to an advanced level. A number of OSAIS Student Teachers manage the delivery of the academic courses offered by OSAIS. Some of these courses include 'Ilm Al Tajweed (Science ofIntonation), 'Ilm As Seerah (Key Biographies), 'Ilm Al Tafseer (commentary of the Quran), G.C.S.E. and A Level Arabic. OSAIS also conducts Day Studies and short courses, when possible, in the academic year. Examples of such Day Studies in the past include, washing and shrouding of the deceased, medical ethics, me and my community and arbitration.

Events 2018/2019

As well as holding regular educational classes and one-day courses for adults, OSAIS also holds other events through its academic year. This facilit tes a unique sense of sister and brotherhood between students from all classes, Student Teachers and the management teams, as well as providing a chance to meet and discuss OSAIS related issues and training.

From the period April 2018 to March 2019 this has included the below:

- Eid gathering for all students and families with an opportunity to socialise across the student body June and August 2018.
- Bi annual meeting between all team members and management team with ACT (known internally as the In Person Shoora or Consultation) July 2018 and January 2019.
- OSAIS AGM (known internally as General Shoora or Consultation) for all students to meet, engage in presentations and group discussions with a chance to offer suggestions and ask questions. Includes lunch and opportunity to socialise - August 2018
- End of term exams for OSAIS October 2018 and March 2019
- Awards Ceremony for The Azhari Madrasat students July 2018
- Intensive Arabic week study for Adults- August 2018.
- Parents evening and Open day for The Azhari Madrasat September 2018.
- Student/professional gathering December 2018
- Training for all Student Teachers of the School, Student Teacher Inset ST INSET/The Azhari Madrasat Teacher Training - 11th May
- Sisters Day Study in Prestwich Muslim Women's Challenges in the Modern Time February 2019.

Extra-Curricular Activities have included:

- Extra-Curricular Activities have included attendance to College and University Jumu'ah in the North West (Friday prayers) on a weekly basis.
- Various meetings have been organised with Scholars throughout the year to engage in bettering community relations through Interfaith.
- OSAIS have attended events upon invite to talk on specific topics in Manchester, Bradford, Bolton, Oldham, Rochdale, Wigan (2018-2019).
- Residential weekend trips visiting various mosques around the UK. This is for both men and women (known internally as Masturat Dawat Retreat)-May 2018, June 2018 and Jan 2019.
- Residential weekend trips visiting various mosques around the UK for men (known internally as Dawat retreat)-April, May, August, September, October and December 2018, January, February, March 2019.

Review of Activities and Achievements

Development

- The refurbishment work in the OSAIS Centre had been completed and the site is now fully functional. Discussion has taken place for further work to be undertaken by OSAIS to utilise the space, in particular the basement in order to use The Centre to its maximum potential; however this is dependant on funding. The Centre has a usage policy allowing OSAIS to know the limitations for conditions of use. This is available for public viewing upon request.
- OSAIS had completed phase one of their new website and this is updated by the OSAIS Team
 http://theopenschool.org It is hoped this will allow greater efficiency for students and those
 working in OSAIS and also allow the general public to learn more about the ethos of OSAIS. New
 student enquiries are made through the website. In order to further their development using social
 media and IT, OSAIS have been actively looking into the use of Google Apps, Facebook and
 virtual classrooms.
- OSAIS launched The Azhari Madrasat in October 2016. The work has been challenging for those involved with highly detailed lesson plans, feedback to parents, project work and end of year presentations by the children. The children have greatly benefitted from the high standard oflslamic children's education, with the core subjects and the opportunity to express their learning through different means. A new intake is planned for September 2019.

Future Plans

- To have additional teachers to assist the various classes for The Azhari Madrasat.
- To continue with the annual Open days for The Azhari Madrasat.
- To promote the availability of the OSAIS centre for community activities, Nikkah (wedding) ceremonies, and educational activities this would have the added benefit of providing additional finance in order to deal with the outstanding payments on the purchased building.

To continue work on improving our I.T. facilities and being involved in social media to promote the work of OSAIS.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEE'S OF THE OPEN SCHOOL FOR ARABIC AND ISLAMIC STUDIES (OSAIS)

I report on the. accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2019, which are set out on pages 6 to 10.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and follow the recommendations in Accounting artd Reporting by Charities: Slalem 11ls uf Recommended Practice (SORP) issued in March 2005.

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis following the trustee's assurance that they will continue to support the charity and anticipate that additional income will be received in the next twelve months to support the project.

Cash flow

The accounts do not include a cash flow statement because the company, is a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement under Financial Reporting Standard 1 'Cash flow statements'.

Income

The accounts include income on the following basis: -

Voluntary income is received by the way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the statements of Financial Activities when receivable. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Expenditure

Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they incurred. Resources expended include attributable .YAT, which cannot be recovered.

Taxation

The company is a registered charity and as such is entitled to the exemption from tax to the extent that the income received falls within section 505 ICTA 1988 and section 256 CGTA 1992 and is applied to charitable purposes only.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure, which meets these criteria, is charged to the fund, together with a fair allocation of management and support costs.
