Structure, governance and management

Tonbridge Welcomes Refugees was registered with the Charity Commission as a CIO (Charitable Incorporated Organisation) on 11 July 2017. Our governing document is our constitution (foundation model).

Appointment of trustees

The charity's first trustees were Johanna Elderfield, Fiona O'Brien and Ruth Connelly (serving from July 2017 for an initial period of three years). Subsequent trustees are appointed by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity's trustees for a term of three years. Nicky McGregor and Jeanette Haywood (who has since moved abroad for work) were formally appointed trustees at the AGM on 11th December 2018. Jane Blessley was appointed trustee at a trustees' meeting on 17th January 2019.

We are actively looking for more trustees. Please speak to any of us if you are interested in finding out more.

Objectives and Activities

Our charity's objects, as set out in our constitution, are as follows:

- 1. For the relief of those granted refugee status and their dependents, or those seeking asylum living (temporarily or permanently) in Kent.
 - (a) The relief of financial hardship;
 - (b) The preservation and protection of their physical and mental health;
 - (c) The advancement of their education and training so as to advance them in life and assist them to adapt within a new community.
- 2. To advance the education of the public in general about the rights and needs of refugees and asylum seekers.

Activities:

We work closely with Kent County Council and staff from their appointed social care provider, Clarion, to support refugees resettled under the government's **Syrian Vulnerable Persons' Resettlement Scheme (SVPRS)** in our area of Kent, specifically in the Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council (TMBC) area. We do this by assigning small teams of volunteers to support each family, by welcoming and befriending visits soon after initial arrival, sourcing household and other items, accompanying and/or giving lifts to appointments, advocating for their needs, all while cooperating closely with their designated Clarion support worker.

When the UK government expanded the SVPRS in September 2015 to accept 20,000 refugees, predominantly from Syria, over the course of 5 years (i.e. before 2020) the

founding members of TWR, Fiona O'Brien and Joh Elderfield, successfully lobbied our local council, TMBC, to commit to a target of welcoming ten families under the scheme. So far, there are five families resettled in our council area, soon to be seven, and it is looking likely that TMBC will meet its target of ten by spring 2020. This would not be possible without the wonderful support of local landlords who agreed to take part in this scheme, despite the fact that the funding only covers rent at local LHA rates, rather than the level of rent which would be available on the open market. Thanks to them, families who would otherwise still be living in much worse conditions in countries bordering Syria, are now living safely in our community and able to start rebuilding their lives.

In June 2019, the then Home Secretary announced that when the SVPRS officially comes to an end in 2020, this scheme together with two other resettlement programmes, the Vulnerable Children's Resettlement Scheme and the Gateway Protection programme, will be consolidated into a new global scheme. This idea is that this will be simpler to operate and provide greater consistency in the way the UK resettles refugees. This scheme will broaden the geographical focus beyond the Middle East and North Africa. Sajid Javid confirmed in the summer that the UK intended to resettle around 5000 of the world's most vulnerable refugees in the first year of this new scheme. Our understanding is that local authorities will again be approached, as they were when the SVPRS was expanded in 2015, asking them if and how many places they will pledge to resettle under this scheme. The hope is that TMBC may choose to expand their pledge as a result.

As well as the families resettled in the TMBC council area under the SVPRS, we also support a small number of refugee families who did not arrive here via this scheme in Tonbridge as well as in /around Maidstone. Our Maidstone volunteers also work with some of our VPRS families in TMBC, as sometimes their location is closer to Maidstone, as well as Maidstone-based VPRS families. The Maidstone team of volunteers complete their DBS with us as there is no charity or group like TWR operating in this area.

For refugees and asylum seekers newly arrived in the UK, learning or improving English is vital to their future job prospects and longer term settlement. We support refugees' English language needs by running a volunteer-led ESOL teaching programme, supplementing the official classes organised via the council. Our classes are held twice weekly in rooms kindly provided for free by Tonbridge Parish Church, as well as home visits from our volunteer teachers for those who aren't able to access group classes for childcare or other reasons, and supporting students at school when needed. We owe a huge debt of gratitude to Jane Blessley, the head of our English teaching programme, and her fantastic team of teachers who all go above and beyond to support our families. KCC provision of

ESOL has recently doubled from 8 to 16 hours a week, so we are currently reviewing how best to coordinate our volunteer-led ESOL teaching alongside this.

We also work with our sister organisations, Tunbridge Wells Welcomes Refugees (TWWR) and Sevenoaks Welcomes Refugees (SWR) to help support refugees, most of whom have also been resettled under the SVPRS in their respective council areas (Tunbridge Wells Borough Council and Sevenoaks District Council). One way in which we work together is ensuring that the growing Syrian community in our area of West Kent can come together for a monthly social gathering which is held in a church room in Tunbridge Wells. Especially when families first arrive, social isolation can be a significant problem, and these gatherings have been important in helping to reduce this. Coordinating the lifts which many families rely on to attend these gatherings is no small task, and we are very grateful to Amanda Mawdsley who has been carrying this out for us this year. Thank you to everyone who regularly offers lifts to our families for appointments, outings and social gatherings. We are always grateful for volunteer drivers, as we often receive requests for lifts. However, we do have to balance our eagerness to help provide this service with encouraging more independence and use of public transport where available. We will always prioritise requests for lifts for those with particular needs, medical or otherwise, or those living in remote locations, and medical appointments, for example, are given priority.

We also run, jointly with local charity Empathy Action, a women's **Craft and Conversation group** every Wednesday in Tonbridge. Thank you to Sandy Glanfield from Empathy Action, who runs this, as well as the volunteers who help out.

Fundraising/events and awareness: We entered a team in the Tonbridge Dragon Boat Race for the third year running – this is our main fundraising event of the year. Thank you very much to all our team members, those who helped us run the stall or baked cakes for it, and especially to Nicky McGregor for her superb organisation. We are planning to run another fundraising quiz here at TOFS next year on Thursday 27 February after the success of the last one. We are always looking for people who would like to get involved in helping us to plan, organise and manage events and help with fundraising. We were also happy to be selected as one of the charities of the month by Waitrose for their green tokens scheme for June (coinciding with Refugee Week), which raised £340 as well as raising our profile locally. In September we were also very happy to be invited to take part in Tonbridge Parish Church's community day by running a stall there.

We are very grateful to our **regular givers** –supporters who have set up a regular donation. The supporters are small in number (currently three) but these monthly donations make a real difference to us, and their generosity is one of the main reasons our income is up from

last year. A regular monthly donation, however small, is a very effective way to support us as it helps us to plan our income. So we would really welcome any more regular donations. Even if you can only give £2 a month, if ten people all did that, it all adds up for us.

Achievements and performance

- Through lobbying TMBC and working closely with both KCC and TMBC and Clarion, promoting the government's resettlement scheme locally, and persuading private landlords to let their properties to refugee families, TWR has assisted in facilitating five, soon to be more, Syrian families in being resettled in Tonbridge & Malling under SVPRS, who would otherwise still be living in much worse conditions in countries bordering Syria.
- TWR has supported these families in both financial and material ways by e.g. funding broadband contracts to enable them to keep in touch with loved ones, supplying household goods, bikes, computers, items of furniture and other needed items, many of which have been sourced for free, as donations. We have also this year introduced an activities fund, to enable access to more extra-curricular activities which would otherwise be difficult financially for some of our beneficiaries, especially children, to take part in. So far we have supported membership of football and other clubs as well as outings, allotment hire etc.
- Our English language teaching programme, which started running in February 2017, has provided refugees, many of whom have very little or no English on arrival, with expert, small group and, when appropriate, individual tuition. This has supplemented the official English language provision and also, by providing home visits, solved the problems experienced by some family members of access to other classes. This year we have offered twice-weekly classes at the parish church, regular home tuition, and support in schools for children.
- A couple of years ago, TWR trained and provided mentors for a small number of refugees and asylum seekers living locally, following a grant awarded by Kent Community Fund. These mentoring relationships were very positive. However, due to limited resources, mostly lack of available volunteers to take it forward, the mentoring scheme remains on hold. We still hope one day to have enough resources to relaunch and expand this scheme.
- Before officially becoming a charity, we ran two very successful community
 engagement events which succeeded in raising our profile and awareness of
 refugee issues in general. Our first event, in June 2016, was One World Day to mark
 Refugee Week, which was opened by Nicolas Heslop, leader of TMBC. In June
 2017, our second event, Rock for Refugees, also marked Refugee Week but also
 doubled as Tonbridge's Great Get Together in memory of Jo Cox MP, who did so

much to advocate for refugees. This event was opened by her colleague and our MP, Tom Tugendhat. We have not had any spare volunteer capacity to organise our own events in 2018 and 2019, though as well as our presence at the Dragon Boat Race we ran charity stalls at Tonbridge Farmers' Market and at Tonbridge Calling festival last year and would have been back at Tonbridge Calling this year, but the event was sadly cancelled.

- Since July 2017, we have entered a team three years in a row in the Tonbridge
 Dragon Boat race, which was successful both in terms of fundraising and profile
 raising. This year we raised £1640 both from sponsorship, and from donations to
 the stall we ran on the day. Big thanks to Nicky McGregor for organising this.
- We have worked to ensure that our work has been covered whenever possible in local media. In June our Chair, Ruth Connelly, was interviewed in the Kent & Sussex Courier and spoke on BBC Radio Kent to talk about TWR's work and the need for landlords to take part in the VPRS.
- The trustees are currently reviewing all our policies and procedures, which is quite
 a lengthy process, and we would like to especially thank Stacy Washington for her
 expert advice in reviewing our safeguarding policy. Our new safeguarding policy will
 be sent out to volunteers.
- One of our ongoing aims is to reduce our running costs, and so we are grateful to Dominic Burns of Burns & Co. accountants for allowing us to use their office as a c/o address, enabling us to cancel our expensive PO box number.

Financial review

Our financial report provided by our Treasurer, Nicky McGregor, is attached.

Aims and objectives

- We would like to see TMBC's pledge of resettling a total of ten families by 2020 under SVPRS fulfilled, and hope to see this pledge increase following the announcement of the new global resettlement scheme. We aim to continue to work closely with TMBC, KCC and Clarion to enhance this process for all concerned.
- We will continue to support the development of English language skills for refugees in our community, by arranging volunteer-led ESOL teaching, ensuring that our volunteer teachers are well supported, including with a proper budget.
- We will continue to promote regular giving as a sustainable, predictable income stream, aiming to significantly increase our number of regular givers.
- We will continue to work to drive down our running costs as far as possible (e.g. by reducing venue hire costs) and keep reviewing our spending priorities to ensure as

- much support as possible for our beneficiaries, particularly as those who arrived here earliest approach their fifth year of the scheme and look at options for their future.
- We will encourage the families we work with under SVPRS to become more independent, both in day to day matters e.g. supporting them to manage their own affairs, make appointments for themselves, request lifts to social gatherings, and with longer term challenges e.g. supporting them in accessing training/finding work.
- We will continue to raise awareness of refugee issues by communicating positive messages to the community as well as arranging and taking part in local community engagement events, such as the Dragon Boat race, Tonbridge Calling etc.
- Subject to availability of suitable volunteers, we would like to develop our outreach
 work e.g. with local schools. We have in the past run school assemblies and given
 talks to local community groups, but our capacity to do this has become limited as
 the number of beneficiaries in the area has grown, shifting the focus of the work
 carried out by our small core team of active volunteers.
- Subject to availability of trustees and volunteers able to help lead on this as a significant commitment, we will aim to restart and develop the mentoring scheme.
- Most immediately, we urgently need to expand our pool of active volunteers and recruit additional trustees. Without the significant commitment of new people, none of the above work will be sustainable long-term. Our small team of trustees is stretched to its limits as we are also among the most active volunteers. We need more help in all areas, not just the activities we would like to do more such as outreach and events, but also the vital work of direct family support and the vital behind the scenes work, the admin and running of the charity. Please do come and have a chat with us if you are interested in doing more or just finding out more.
