Structure, governance and management

Middle Street School Fund (MSS Fund) is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) governed by a constitution based on the Charity Commission's 'Foundation' model constitution. The constitution was approved by the initial set of trustees of the charity on 5th December 2017 and then the charity was registered with the Charity Commission on 18th December 2017.

The most notable change from the model constitution is in section 10.(2) which specifies how the Governing Board of Middle Street School may appoint five charity trustees. This is the only formal link between the CIO and the school. Trustees can also be appointed by the existing trustees of the CIO.

Although the constitution does not require this, the trustees have adopted the convention of appointing a Chair and a Treasurer.

As the charity is currently very small and simple in its operations and is not delivering any services directly to any children or parents or carers, therefore no additional policies or procedures have been adopted by the CIO.

Objectives and activities

The objects of the CIO as laid out in its constitution are:

The object of the CIO shall be to advance the education of the pupils at Middle Street School by providing or assisting in the provision of educational, recreational, sporting and other charitable services, equipment or facilities in augmentation of such services, equipment and facilities financed by the Local Education Authority or the Department of Education and Employment (DFEE).

In order to meet these objectives the focus of the CIO is to raise funds which can then be donated to Middle Street School in order that the school can directly deliver the services to the children at the school. The CIO does not deliver services directly to children.

The main activities of the charity during this year were:

- To become formally established as a registered charity and set up a suitable bank account.
- To send out letters and a form to parent, carers and to anyone else interested, asking for individual donations or regular standing orders that will provide funds that will support the core budget of Middle Street School.
- To make the information about how to make donations to the MSS Fund available on the school's website.

These activities were undertaken with due regard by the trustees to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

Achievements and performance

During this year the charity had the following notable achievements:

- By the year end 12 standing orders had been set up that together made a total monthly contribution of £275 to the MSS Fund.
- The yearly total from such standing orders was: £2,270
- The total of one-off donations was: £211
- The total amount raised by the charity in the first year was: £2,481

Financial Review

MSS Fund prepares its accounts as receipts and payments accounts in line with the Charity Commission guidance *Charity reporting and accounting: the essentials November 2016 (CC15d)*. The accounts are prepared as a separate document to this report using the template from the Charity Commission called *Template for Receipts and Payments Accounts - CC16a_- revisions_190417.xls*.

The MSS Fund set up its bank account with Metro Bank in January 2018.

One issue that MSS Fund had to deal with during the year was that a number of erroneous Direct Debits were set up against the Metro Bank that were not created by anyone from the charity. A total of £84.35 was falsely removed from the account in this way during November and December 2018. Metro Bank was alerted to these false debits from the account and the Direct Debits were cancelled and the money returned to MSS Fund. However the funds were returned in January 2019, which is part of the next financial year for the charity. Therefore this has been accounted for this year as money owed to the charity.

On 5th December 2018 the bank account of MSS Fund held £2,396.65 cash.

MSS Fund does not have a policy on holding reserves as it currently does not have any expenses.
