Structure, governance and management

Governing document

Kidderminster Harriers F. C. Football in the Community is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on July 20, 2001 and registered as a charity on July 10, 2002. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £10.

Appointment of trustees

The trustees who are directors for the purpose of company law and trustees for the purpose of charity law, who served during the year and up to the date of this report, are set out on page 1. New trustees are appointed upon the recommendation of existing trustees. One third of the trustees must retire at each annual general meeting and offer themselves for re-election.

Risk management

The trustees have examined the major business and operational risks to which the charity is exposed and confirm that systems have been established to enable regular reports to be produced so that the necessary steps can be taken to lessen their risks.

Objectives and activities

The objects of the charity are to further and assist in the education (on a social and physical basis) of children attending schools within the Worcestershire and surrounding areas through the use of the game of football (including its history and rules) and other ancillary sporting activities as educational tools and in furtherance of that objective to provide in Worcestershire and its surrounding area facilities at Kidderminster Harrier's football ground for meetings, lectures and classes for the benefit of such children.

In shaping the objectives for the year and planning the activities, the trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit,

The charity carries out these objects by providing a wide range of football related activities that promote all of the below objectives throughout all areas of engagement.

- Provide and promote a healthier lifestyle to all
- Ensure that an inclusive environment is developed
- Promote the benefits of football
- Ensure enjoyment and fun are constantly present

We provide sports activities throughout Worcestershire. We have a group of committed staff who are at least FA Level 2 qualified with some coaches being UEFA A/B qualified, many of the coaches are actually exprofessional players themselves. Each year we work with an average of 15,000 children across all of our programmes and desire to develop footballing talent alongside creating healthier community. In 2018/19 we were awarded Community Club of the Year by the National League Trust, for the second time.

Achievements and performance

School Engagement

Working with schools during curriculum time to deliver our "Healthkick" Programme is a major part of our school based provision as is our PPA Cover, After School and Lunch Clubs. Our school based provision is not just football specific and ranges from cricket to basketball, from netball to hockey plus many more sports and teambuilding activities. Each year 70 schools are a part of our school engagement across Worcestershire and new schools can also become involved. Another part of our school engagement programme is our "Penalty Shootout" competition where pupils face off against their peers to become their schools penalty king or queen. The winners from each school will showcase their talent on the Agg borough pitch in the grand finale

Gifted & Talented

Our gifted and talented courses are for players with high ability levels and a desire to learn. Gifted and talented operates three 10-week training blocks per-season with matches played against local teams and other G&T centres. From U12, players can trial for our Development Centre teams (U12-16).

Half-Term Soccer Camps

Our holiday courses for 5-14 year olds are held during every holiday period in: Kidderminster, Droitwich, Bromsgrove, Worcester, Malvern, Cleobury Mortimer and Kinver. All courses run from 10am-3pm and all have emphasis on development through fun and enjoyment via skill based activities and small sided games. Plenty of prizes are on offer at each camp

Soccer Saturdays (3yrs - 12yrs)

Soccer Saturday is about football engagement and developing players from as early as 3yrs old through fun based activities, weekly competitions and small sided games. These sessions take place every Saturday morning at Baxter College (Kidderminster), DY11 5PQ between 10:30am-11:45am.

MiniKickers (5yrs - 9yrs)

MiniKickers offers weekly football sessions for children aged five to nine, with courses held throughout the school year. The courses are great introduction to football in a fun and friendly environment, with medals and trophies awarded

Community Club of the Week

Each Kidderminster Harriers FC home game will see a local community football club become our very own "Community Club of the Week". This will enable a local club to bring along as many of their players (under 16 only) free of charge to a fixture of their choice (availability dependent). Every club involved will be able to showcase their club in the match day programme and have players as pitch side mascots for the game, giving them the chance to be part of a vibrant match day experience

Walking Football

W Cold

For those who have always enjoyed playing or watching football and are 55yrs plus this is a great opportunity to stay active, keep playing football, meet new peers and ensure you stay healthy. Our Walking Football Sessions take place weekly and are growing each week as more people from the local community become involved.

HealthKick and HeartSave

The charity continues to work with sponsors and partners from business and local government on projects to promote healthy living and improve the educational and training outcomes of young people. During the year funding was received from the National League Trust and Worcestershire County Council Councillors for the HealthKick programme which involves exercise, healthy eating, smoking, dental care, emotional health and well being and road safety.

It also includes the new Life Saving Project, which aims to train 2000 children in local schools in basic life-saving skills.

Financial review

The net income for the year amounted to £21 (2018 £2,989) leaving funds to be carried forward of £81,385 (2018 £81,364.)

Reserves

It is the policy of the trustees to maintain reserves at the level required to cover staff wages for the period of six months.

Plans for future periods

The charity plans to continue with its main programme of activities during the coming year and, following support from Sport England, football sessions are being launched for anyone with learning or physical disabilities.

The Trustees have established Mission and Vision statements as follows:

Future Mission:

Encourage more people, especially children to play and watch football for the good of the game and our community and to promote healthy lifestyles and positive activities for our community.

Our Vision:

To make sure that activities are available for all regardless of age, religion, ethnic background, ability and gender, ensuring that the scheme remains a "community scheme" and doesn't become a commercial operation as positively impacting the community is the main objective.

1. General information

The charity is a public benefit entity and a private company limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales and a registered charity in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is 61 Macrae Road, Pill, Bristol, BS20 0DD, UK.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Companies Act 2006.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. We confirm that there are no critical judgements or estimates to note.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

3. Accounting policies (continued)

Incoming resources

All income is included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity, it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance.
- investment income is included when receivable
- income from charitable activity are accounted for when earned

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.
- governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the audit fees and costs linked to the strategic management of a charity.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SOFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis.

Tangible assets

Tangible assets are initially recorded at cost, and subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Any tangible assets carried at revalued amounts are recorded at the fair value at the date of revaluation less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

An increase in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of a revaluation, is recognised in other recognised gains and losses, unless it reverses a charge for impairment that has previously been recognised as expenditure within the statement of financial activities. A decrease in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of revaluation, is recognised in other recognised gains and losses, except to which it offsets any previous revaluation gain, in which case the loss is shown within other recognised gains and losses on the statement of financial activities.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Motorvehicles

25% straight line

Equipment

25% straight line

Impairment of fixed assets

A review for indicators of impairment is carried out at each reporting date, with the recoverable amount being estimated where such indicators exist. Where the carrying value exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is impaired accordingly. Prior impairments are also reviewed for possible reversal at each reporting date.

For the purposes of impairment testing, when it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, an estimate is made of the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. The cash-generating unit is the smallest identifiable group of assets that includes the asset and generates cash inflows that largely independent of the cash inflows from other assets or groups of assets.

For impairment testing of goodwill, the goodwill acquired in a business combination is, from the acquisition date, allocated to each of the cash-generating units that are expected to benefit from the synergies of the combination, irrespective of whether other assets or liabilities of the charity are assigned to those units.

Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or paable including any related transaction costs, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where it is recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Current assets and current liabilities are subsequently measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received and not discounted.

Financial assets that are measured at cost or amortised cost are reviewed for objective evidence of impairment at the end of each reporting date. If there is objective evidence of impairment, an impairment loss is recognised under the appropriate heading in the statement of financial activities in which the initial gain was recognised.

Defined contribution plans

Contributions to defined contribution plans are recognised as an expense in the period in which the related service is provided. Prepaid contributions are recognised as an asset to the extent that the prepayment will lead to a reduction in future payments or a cash refund.

When contributions are not expected to be settled wholly within 12 months of the end of the reporting date in which the employees render the related service, the liability is measured on a discounted present value basis. The unwinding of the discount is recognised as an expense in the period in which it arises.
