During the period 31.12.17-30.12.18 ADAF achieved it's aims and objectives by facilitating and supporting the following services within the borough of Ashford:

One Stop Shop- this weekly drop in organized and supported by ADAF has continued to support victims of domestic abuse and numbers attending remain high. Over this period a total of 510 attendees have received advice, information and support. Of these 32 have been men and 119 repeat attendees. Between them the 510 attendees had 888 children who were potentially exposed to abuse.

Freedom programme- Four programmes have been organized and facilitated for this period supporting women into better understanding what domestic abuse is and in so doing helping them move on from abusive relationships and recognize potential future abusers. A new pilot programme called Phoenix was also run. ADAF have contributed and worked with partners across the county to develop this new psycho-educational group for people who have experienced domestic abuse. The pilot supported a total of 42 women. The success of the pilot means that going forward this programme will gradually replace the Freedom programme.

Recovery Toolkit programme- A follow on programme from Freedom. Two programmes have been facilitated for 12 women.

ADAF continued to work with multi-agency partners to ensure a coordinated response to domestic abuse across the district.

Bespoke Domestic abuse training was provided to the William and Harvey Hospital in Ashford.As a result of this training the hospital has secured funding for an IDVA (Independent Domestic Violence Advisor) to work in its A & E department.

A workshop Safety in Action event was also held for

1400 primary school children over a 2 week period. This was run in conjunction with several other agencies including the police and Fire Service.

ADAF is now actively looking to provide a One Stop Shop for the rural areas and those who find it difficult to travel into Ashford.
