Introduction and summary.

Another Space Limited, commonly known as Another Space, has also became synonymous with Lake District Holocaust Project (LDHP), one of the projects that it initiated in 2005 but has now become a major contribution to Holocaust commemoration and education locally, regionally and nationally.

We are now entering an exciting and crucial period for the project as we consider options to develop a permanent base for LDHP in Windermere with an extended exhibition space and archive facilities. Working with other partners we have undertaken research into the feasibility of a sustainable future for the permanent base, which produced very positive outcomes, and have been involved in the initial research and development of major media productions that will promote and expand the profile of the charity and its work. The aim of the media work is to see the charity build on its successes and to work towards securing its activities for the future and to take advantage of its broadening support base.

The project is being driven by support locally and nationally as we strive to provide a fitting commemoration of the links between the child survivors who came to the Lake District in 1945 and the local community who welcomed them.

Objectives

The continuing aim and objective is to educate people in matters of local history through the use and involvement of oral history, archives, documents and exhibitions at the heart of the community. One of the ultimate objectives is to establish a permanent and fitting commemoration in the Lake District of the link between the child Holocaust Survivors and the local area that welcomed them in 1945.

The activities of 2017-18 included major exhibitions by internationally renowned artists that had an inbuilt two year programme, as well as continuing the curation of exhibitions in the permanent space and gallery on the first floor of Windermere Library. The permanent exhibition "From Auschwitz to Ambleside", which tells the story of the three hundred child Holocaust Survivors who came to the Lake District in 1945 directly from the concentration camps of Nazi Occupied Europe, is an increasingly popular visitor experience and education facility.

We continued to produce exhibitions and education activities including the launch of Alfred Huberman Award for Writing and the began the work towards the 2019-20 "From Troutbeck to Treblinka two year programme of archaeolgy at Calgarth Estate/Lakes School through National Lottery Heritage Fund.

Further consultations continued the with Holocaust Commission in Downing Street and with 45 Aid Society (Holocaust Survivors) UK regarding permanent exhibition developments for Windermere.

The space is provided free of charge as support from Cumbria County Council and is a welcome facility for the charity as it enables work to be carried out at the heart of the Lake District and in the location where the child survivors stayed in 1945.

Funding

Funding support for activities in 2017-18 came from a variety of sources.

Total income for the year amounted to £37153. This included significant support from:

- 1. SLDC awarded £2000 towards the exhibitions programme and event.
- 2. Arts Council England awarded £3200 towards the annual programme of activities.
- 3. A donation of £2500 from Maurice Helfgott
- 4. At the years end and award of £24600 was awarded from National Lottery Heritage Fund.
