Structure, governance and management

The charity is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) formed on 30 March 2016.

Method of recruitment and appointment of trustees

Being a Foundation CIO, the only voting members are its trustees. Trustees are appointed for a term of three years by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees.

Objectives and activities

The charity's objects

To relieve the need of asylum seekers and/or refugees by providing items and services to: individuals in need, charities, or other non government organisations with the same aims.

The charity's main activities

Refugees START was established to support refugees and asylum seekers (and projects and individuals working to support them) in the UK and Europe. Since we began operating in 2015, we have also taken on management of Yorkshire Aid – a pre existing group of local volunteers in Leeds- we added Yorkshire Aid as an operating name for the charity in this reporting period.

Our current activities focus on collecting & sorting, or buying, material donations such as clothing, tents, blankets, toiletries and food to send to warehouses in Calais for refugees living in Northern France, and to Greece to specific projects/ teams working with refugees there.

We also provide support to refugees and asylum seekers in the Yorkshire region by responding to requests for aid from organisations who work with them locally.

The charity's main activities (continued)

We distribute any surplus / unsuitable donations to local homeless organisations, foodbanks and other local charities to minimise waste and ensure as much of the donations we receive as possible are put to good use.

Public benefit statement

In setting our objectives and planning our activities our Trustees have given serious consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and in particular the prevention or relief of poverty, overseas aid / famine relief and the advancement of health or saving of lives.

Achievements and performance

During this accounting period we were initially hosted by the Slung Low Theatre Company at Bath Road, Holbeck, Leeds LS11.

From there, we continued to work towards achieving the same outcomes, albeit on a smaller scale, due to reduced capacity at the new location.

We collected, sorted, and funded the transportation of multiple van loads of donations to Calais warehouses for distribution to refugees in Northern France (predominantly to Care4Calais) .

We continued to bring back to the UK on the return journeys, van loads of waste/unsuitable donations from Care4Calais, to help relieve their waste management problems. These items are then sorted and repurposed/recycled,

We led an extremely successful salvaging mission with a large group of volunteers to collect useful items in the aftermath of the Leeds Festival, and were able to collect hundreds of tents, sleeping bags and roll mats, which were then taken to Calais in Q3 18/19.

We collected, sorted and paid for transportation of a large palletised shipment of much needed women's sanitary items, and children and women's clothing to Greece.

We continued to receive and meet requests from local partner organisations for practical aid/supplies for refugees and asylum seeking families in the Yorkshire area- in particular establishing a close working relationship with Meeting Point in Armley.

We were invited by the theatre to move with them to their new location at the Holbeck Social Club, where we continue to be hosted at present .

We are continuing the search for additional space more suited to hosting volunteer sessions, to enable our former, very well attended sorting sessions to recommence in 2020.

Our thermal imaging equipment continued to be loaned out and put to productive use by Refugee Rescue, a volunteer group engaged in search and rescue of boats off Lesvos island, Greece. It was returned to us in early 2019 as no longer needed. (We are currently considering options for potential disposal/further loan).

Do you have a washing machine? Can you help us?



Basis of accounting
