Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

We successfully started the year with our FSOS [Flames School of the spirit], of which each course/module was well attended

The charity has carried out missionary work in Kenya Nigeria and Sierra Leone. This involves ministering to widows, orphans and empowering people in impoverished communities to better themselves by using biblical principles.

The charity held monthly conferences in London to reach out to young adults and local families. The conferences consist of evangelistic teachings, prayers and counselling.

The charity put a homeless outreach programme. This was carried out in collaboration with the local Waltham Forest council and Newham Council. The charity also worked with several retail chains including Boots, who provided discounted sandwiches to the charity which were purchased for the homeless. Starbucks also supported the Charity's work by providing free coffee which were distributed to the homeless and the local community through volunteers from the charity.
