In planning our events for the year, we kept in mind the Charity Commissions guidelines on Public Benefit at our meetings.

Our main activities are as follows:

- a programme of social events and recreational opportunities
- raising awareness in the wider community of the benefits of adopting inclusive attitudes
- offering the opportunity for personal growth through education and training

These events and activities benefit all members by: promoting a sense of belonging, improving self confidence and social skills, improved physical and mental wellbeing, reduced social isolation, greater physical activity and more time outdoors, peer support, and by providing an opportunity for all members, regardless of ability, gender, faith or circumstance, to contribute or partake at their own level.

We would like to acknowledge the significant contribution from our volunteers without whom we could not function. Volunteers hours for the year were incredible.

We would also like to acknowledge the invaluable support, guidance, training and enthusiasm from Community and Voluntary Services, Cheshire East.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Our main project planned for the year was <u>Project ALFIE</u> (Accessible Location For Inclusive Events). This relied upon an offer of a 6 months rent free venue in the centre of town. Unfortunately, the venue owner retracted the offer 9 days before we were due to move in due to the possibility of a paying tenant. As a result we had to significantly scale back and re-plan our range of events and activities, which in turn meant that we could no longer reach many of our anticipated beneficiaries. However, we miraculously managed to find a room for two of the three days of Disabled Access Day 2017 Weekend which was to be the opening event of Project Alfie. This allowed us to promote the group and our work, provide some taster sessions of activities, network with other local organisations, reach new members and raise awareness within our local community. Project Alfie has been put on hold while we continue to investigate other options for accommodation.

Throughout the year our <u>monthly socials</u> proved popular and were well attended, providing peer support and feedback from members re: preferred activities.

<u>Activities to promote wellbeing</u> included picnics, accessible dog walks, members and families swimming sessions, reflexology and Indian head massage, mental wellbeing workshop

<u>Educational events and skill sharing opportunities</u> included training from CVS CE (e.g. GDPR training, Trustee training, etc), arts and crafts sessions, assistance dog demonstration and talk, opportunities to try mobility equipment, and sharing knowledge of local resources and providers of practical support.

While most of our events had a social element, purely <u>social and</u> <u>entertainment activities</u> included members birthday celebrations, a visit to the circus, visiting a member in respite care, meals out, Christmas party, CVS volunteers gala, Invacar restoration and cake, film nights, BBQs

<u>Promoting awareness</u> events included manning a stand at the CVS CE volunteers fayre, having several stands and displays over Disabled Access Day weekend, exchange visits with a friendship group in Salford.

We were also gifted and have taken delivery of a used and non-roadworthy <u>minibus</u>. We have combined cleaning and evaluating the state of the minibus with cake, chilling and chatting (and the occasional water fight) to turn a necessary chore into fun afternoons.
