To develop the capacity and skills of the members of the socially and economically disadvantaged community of the Ashanti region of Ghana in such a way that they are better able to identify, and help meet, their needs and to participate more fully in their own community.

To advance the education of the pupils at Asantoa Model school in Kumasi, by providing and assisting in the provision of additional resources not required to be provided by the local education authority for education at the school.

The focus in meeting the public benefit aspects of the foundations purpose has been to provide resources that enable the communities to develop their financial independence by acquiring and sharing new skills that provide a regular income, with a means of becoming more sustainable.

An example of this has been the delivery of a Jewellery workshop held in three areas of the Ashanti region in Ghana. Students of the classes acquired transferable skills that enabled them to set up small enterprises which generated a wage for themselves.

## Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

This year the foundation has worked with 30 volunteers from 4 communities in Ghana, West Africa.

The charity has supported two schools in Ghana providing them with donations of clothing, toiletries, food items, for direct use by the children and stationery and other equipment for use and recycling by the schools.

Jewellery workshops held in three areas of the Ashanti region of Ghana. Attended by over 80 participants from different age groups and genders.

Those who completed the classes were given starter packs from which they were able to set up small self-employment enterprises,

We also went to Tarkwa Banso in the Wasa West of Ghana to review the clinic that had been built four years ago. Significant progress had been made over this time, with the establishment of a small maternity unit, allowing the clinic to reach new villages. The clinic reported that over the four years there has been a major decrease in the childbirth mortality rate.

Over Christmas the foundation provided resources that enabled over 150 children and their families to celebrate with a special meal and to join in festivities.

UK - we have supported several local charities through donations of clothing, bedding and footwear. Resources were received through donations from Churches and individuals throughout the period.

The plans for a few fundraising activities have not yet materialised, hence most of our activities have been through in-kind donations of gifts and time.

These donations have been helpful in allowing the charity to meet its key objective of helping towards relief of poverty in the Ashanti region. It reinforced the foundations belief that giving money directly to communities would not lift communities out of poverty.

A key part of the fundraising strategy is to generate in-kind income – volunteer time and skill to leverage finance from within Ghana itself.
