REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE PERIOD 26 APRIL 2018 TO 31 MARCH 2019

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the period 26 April 2018 to 31 March 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

INTRODUCTION

Queenborough Fishery Trust (CIO) was registered with the Charities Commission on 26 April 2018. The charity was set up to takeover and continue the work of the old charities, Queenborough Fishery Trust and Swale Recreation Trust, within a newly incorporated body.

No activities were undertaken within the new CIO during the period, the charitable activities remained within the old charities until the date of transfer, 29 April 2019.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objects of the charity are:

- a) The prevention or relief of poverty and sickness in the Isle of Sheppey (including in particular the area of the former Borough of Queenborough), the towns of Faversham and Sittingbourne and the parishes of Bapchild, Bobbing, Borden, Boughton-Under Blean, Bredgar, Doddington, Dunkirk, Eastling, Graveney and Goodnestone, Hartlip, Hernhill, Iwade, Lower Halstow, Luddenham, Lynsted and Kingsdown, Milstead, Newington, Norton, Buckland and Stone, Oare, Ospringe, Otterden, Rodmersham, Selling, Sheldwich, Badlesmere and Leaveland, Stalisfield, Teynham, Throwley, Tonge, Tunstall, and Upchurch, all in the county of Kent and all as at 1 September 2017 (area of benefit) by providing grants, items and services to individuals in need and/or charities, or other organisations working to prevent or relieve poverty and sickness.
- b) The provision and support of facilities for the recreation and other leisure time occupation in the interests of social welfare and with the object of improving the condition of life of the inhabitants of the area of benefit.
- c) To advance the education in the area of benefit by providing and assisting in the provision of facilities for education.
- d) To further such other purposes which may be charitable according to the law of England and Wales as the trustees see fit from time to time to the benefit of the inhabitants of the area of benefit.

Provided always that such purposes shall not extend to those purposes for which provision is made out of rates, taxes, or other public funds except in exceptional circumstances that in the opinion of the trustees justify such further provision.

Public benefit

The trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

As detailed above in the introduction, no charitable activities have taken place within the new charity during the period. All activities remained within the old charities, Queenborough Fishery Trust and Swale Recreation Trust, until the date of transfer, 29 April 2019.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

At the end of the year the charity held no assets or liabilities as these all remained within the old charities, as described above.

FUTURE PLANS

The old charities transferred the assets, liabilities and charitable activities to the newly incorporated CIO on 29 April 2019.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes a charitable incorporated organisation.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Trustees are appointed for four year terms of office. Two trustees are nominated by Swale Borough Council, two by Queenborough Town Council and six are recruited from the local community through an open recruitment process.

Risk management

The trustees actively review, on a regular basis, the major risks which the charity faces and believe that building reserves to agreed levels, combined with an annual review of the controls over key financial systems, will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The trustees have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the charity and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate the significant risk.
