REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The hall is used by many various clubs and organisations in the community. All the lettings monies are used to cover day to day hall expenses. We all so organise our own fundraising activities with all proceeds going towards the hall.

Significant activities

On 26th April 2019, the Management Committee proudly held an opening night showcasing the newly completed refurbished Hall. Following the £70k renovation of the Palmer Hall, community groups now use the hall, recruiting more people to join and encouraging even more groups to start up in the hall. The variety of community groups that are now using the facilities offer a wide range of activities and interest including circuit training, boxing, Zumba, Pilates, aerobics, cinema, Ki Chi, Ballet and line dancing.

Volunteers

The committee are made up from volunteers from organisations that use the hall. Volunteers are encouraged to join at the AGM and through general conversations.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Fundraising activities

We continue to raise funds through the 100 Club who gave £1,000 this year towards the refurbishments; the monthly cinema continues to grow attracting new people from the new housing developments. Our Spring Fayre was very successful and we continue with our Christmas Fayre which is growing in popularity. Next spring we are having a Vintage Tea Fundraiser – offering cream teas and fizz. We are able to offer the hall with our new facilities to all people within the community including disabled as we have the new toilet facilities.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

For the year to 31 March 2019 the charity received almost \pounds 60,000 in funds from all sources, these funds boosted by major donations for the purpose of the refurbishment to the hall. These sums have been separately accounted for as a restricted resource for that sole purpose.

Principal funding sources

Main income is from the hall lettings, user groups, parties, cinema and donations (1 off payments)

Reserves policy

There is no formal set level of reserves adhered to by the charity. Money is currently being held to fund the completion of renovations from the donations which continued after 31 March 2019. The trustees are also mindful that a level of reserves also needs to be held to ensure the short term running costs can be covered.

FUTURE PLANS

To secure the use of the hall for current and new regular users, and to attract large functions such as christenings, weddings and the RAF English / American Association Group. We are starting to fundraise now for the refurbishment of the kitchen and the outside of the building.
