WORCESTERSHIRE PARENT AND CARERS' COMMUNITY TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

Worcestershire Parent and Carers' Community is registered with the Charity Commission and governed by a constitution dated 30 January 2007. It is an association with 700 members including 130 member families. The Charity's registered number, trustees and principal address are detailed on page 1. New trustees are selected and appointed by the trustees from within and outside the membership.

The trustees confirm that in undertaking their work they have complied with the duty within section 4 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit.

Objects of the Charity

The objects of the charity set out in the constitution are the provision of relief to people with a disability; in particular by providing help and support to them, their families and dependents and by assisting with the planning and development of services locally in Worcestershire.

The charity focuses on supporting the parents and carers of disabled children and their families and bringing them out of isolation. It provides opportunities for social contact, specialist family inclusive activities, practical and emotional support and signposting to relevant support organisations.

Summary of the main activities and achievements

During the year to 31 March 2019 we have continued our work supporting parents and carers and helping them to support themselves and each other. Our activities have included:

- coffee mornings, workshops, yoga and health and wellbeing sessions through which parents and carers can relax and gather information, meet others facing the same challenges and build support networks.
- a range of family inclusive activities enabling the whole family to enjoy a break in the company of
 other member families and providing opportunities for friendship. The year's activities included a
 family fun day, Wildlife Trust visit, swimming, picnic, Safari park outing, fireworks event and Christmas
 party.
- a youth group for our members aged 14 years and over, with monthly youth group activities in the Wychavon area and quarterly group outings including a residential trip to an outdoor centre. We aim to help our youngsters develop the independence and social skills necessary to grow into confident adults with fulfilling lives
- providing access to a family worker, to provide practical support and signposting advice to families in distress.
- maintaining social media presence and improving our website and information packs including leaflets and newsletters.
- · providing a welcoming base in Worcester
- assisting in the implementation and monitoring of Worcestershire's Carers' Strategy through the Health and Wellbeing Board.
- presenting at a national conference run by the Institute of Voluntary Action Research (IVAR) on Building Healthy Partnerships -'Think Carer' programme.
- continuing to engage with Worcestershire County Council, Carers Action Worcestershire, Young Solutions Worcestershire, Healthwatch Worcestershire and Worcestershire Health and Care NHS Trust in the development of services for people with a disability, particularly families including disabled children.
- maintaining policies and procedures commensurate with a high standard of safeguarding, including providing safeguarding training within the organisation.

Financial sustainability remains a principal challenge. We are dependent on grants and donations for our continued operation and we are tremendously grateful to the organisations and individuals who have supported us this year, enabling us to continue our work including those who have devoted time and effort to fundraising internally.

Reserves Policy

The trustees' policy is to hold reserves representing at least three months operating expenditure to ensure that we can continue to deliver services and meet our financial obligations despite fluctuations in income. Our free reserves at 31 March 2019 are £35,919 (2018 £33,248).
