## Annual Trustee's Report 2018 – 2019 Financial Year

## Summary -

This year has been another good year for Northern Exposure Rescue with 21 events supported over the period and a gentle increase in the number of paid up members/volunteers.

#### **Our Structure**

We still have the three Trustees responsible for the oversight of the charity. These Trustees are Chris Lowe, William Burchnall and Chris Dunn. These Trustees also form part of the Management Committee which includes our Secretary and Child Protection Advisor, Moira Barson. In order to increase participation and involve a wide range of views into the Trustee's group we are actively seeking an additional Trustee to improve the oversight, guidance and support available to the Management Team for dealing with day to day issues. This is not an overnight process as we want to identify the best possible candidate who will be involved for the long term. We intend to find a suitable candidate from our existing membership group. The Trustees have not changed during the period and the structure remains the same.

We have not had any under 18 members during the 18-19 period. This has not been deliberate, but it has reduced the administrative burdens on the Management Committee. As a result, it has been agreed that we will not actively recruit under 18s for membership but then we will not refuse any requests that we receive.

#### Finances -

Our financial report is provided via our account's submission. We have agreed to a reserves policy where we maintain enough financial reserves for 12 months of expenditure.

## **Event Support -**

The diversity of the events we have supported has also increased with rowing, barge races, demonstration events (such as Bluebird at Henley and the Armistice event) dinghy sailing, yacht racing being on our calendar. Participation figures from event organisers suggest we have supported around 16,000 people getting on to the water (assuming unique visits and not including spectators).

We did turn down several event organisers who were requesting our support as they clashed with existing events or were immediately following events the day beforehand. This decision was taken by the Management Team following discussions via our WhatsApp Messaging system. A primary concern for these decisions was not to overstretch our volunteer pool but also a lack of qualified and experienced volunteers to supervise the events and volunteer safety. A lack of available club boats as well are suitable available tow vehicles were significant factors.

Generally speaking, we have stopped seeking out events that we can support and it tends that organisers come to us now. We have reported on our public benefit via social media and our website.

#### Club Boats -

The purchase of Western Protector has consumed significant resources (time and money) getting it prepared and ready for use. It is no secret this has been greater than originally anticipated and the

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sale of Eastern Thunder an easily accessible boat for members to use, has also been a factor in turning down some of the additional events mentioned above.

Northern Exposure 5 has continued to operate well for us with minimal issues.

Routine maintenance and the improvement work on Western Protector have been carried out by Chris Lowe, Moira Barson and John Biggs. On Northern Exposure 5 this has included new navigation lights, engine services, electrical rewiring and trailer repairs. This has been funded by the volunteers themselves primarily, with some of the larger items such as batteries being paid by Northern Exposure Rescue. We are extremely grateful to them for their continued efforts.

Work on Western Protector has included rewiring, engine servicing and repairs, new plotter, repeater stations, new Icom radios, trailer repairs (rollers and winch), new antennas, EPIRB and installing safety equipment. Again Chris, Moira and John have carried out much of the work with Lawrence Cottrell helping with the transport of the boat from location to location.

## Funding -

We have been extremely lucky and have received funding from Sport England to cover the cost of new volunteer PPE and safety equipment. The actual list of equipment purchased included Gill waterproof clothing, Crewsaver lifejackets, rescue knives, helmets, LED flares, EPIRB, Garmin GPS plotter and repeater, Icom radios, VHF antennas, pyrotechnics and first aid equipment.

## Training -

We arranged a first aid refresher course through Thames Active which was held at the Ahoy Centre in Deptford. We were able to secure significant discounts for our eight members who attended the course which included defibrillators.
