### Trustees Annual Report for the year ended 31 March 2019

#### MAJOR ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS IN THE YEAR

At the end of the year we had 154 young members, up slightly from the previous year total of 150.

Subscriptions remained £45 per term through the year having been raised from £40 in January 2016.

Total capitation paid to St Albans District Scouts was £6,776 compared with £6,450 in the previous year as a result in the increase in year end headcount and also as a result of an increase in rate from £43 to £44 per young member.

We recorded Gift Aid income of £3,478 during the year compared with £4,209 in the previous year. Gift aid claims have reduced mainly as a result of reductions in gift aid forms received

The group received donations of £905 in 2019 compared to £1500 in 2018

Expenditure on maintaining the scout hut reduced in 2019 to £200 from £2,433 in 2018. In addition, expenditure on equipment reduced to £1,398 in 2019 from £2,256 in 2018

The General Fund shows a surplus of £620 for the year compared with £6,522 in 2018 with reductions in income to £30,521 from £33,625 in 2018 driven by small reductions subscriptions, gift aid and donations while capitation payments to district increased to £6,776 from £6450 in 2018. At the same time total expenditure (ex depreciation) increased to £29,901 from £27,103 in 2018, the biggest driver being an increase in expenses and camping costs of £17,595 up from £14,288 in 2018. The Building Fund shows a deficit of £3,492 for the year, made up of the annual depreciation charge on the buildings of £3,292 plus cash expenditure of £200. Our reserves, measured by the balance on the General Fund at the year-end, decreased from £31,233 to £27,853 after a transfer of £4,000 to the Buildings Fund. The transfer to the building fund remained the same as the previous year.

The Group is a trust established under its rules that are common to all Groups/Districts.

Trustees are appointed in accordance with the Policy, Organisation & Rules of the Scout Association.

The accounts have been drawn up on the accruals basis that is consistent with the previous year.
