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Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31st March 2019

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st March 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Significant activities

It has been a year of change for The Wheelchair Football Association (WFA) since our last AGM in June 2018 where all but two of the trustees stood down or changed their role within the organisation. September 2018 saw Adam McEvoy appointed as our new National Development Manager, succeeding the outgoing Sam Bull following many years in the position.

Despite these changes, it has been another successful year for the WFA in England and we have continued to see Powerchair Football grow and engage with new people.

With so many changes within the charity, our work has focused on settling everyone into their new roles and we have conducted an audit of the WFAs policies and procedures to ensure we have everything in place. We have also worked in partnership with the Football Association (FA) to review all aspects of safeguarding and have worked closely with member clubs to ensure all coaches, administration staff and officials have relevant CRB checks in order to carry out their roles safely. Improving our lines of communication with members and giving greater exposure to the WFA brand have been at the forefront of our work.

The Powerchair Football community is a very tight knit group of people who share a huge passion for the sport. We must remain a close-knit community to ensure we use that strength in numbers to help grow the sport and seek new partners and funding opportunities moving forward.

I must take this opportunity to thank the WFA Executive Committee for all their hard work over the last 12 months and for their dedication to their roles. I must also thank the volunteers that help to run and support our Powerchair clubs and to the parents and carers that support the players in playing and accessing our wonderful sport.

Finally, I would like to say a huge thank you to the partner organisations we work with, your support is much appreciated and we look forward to continuing our work in the future.

Best of luck to all players, coaches and clubs for the 2019/2020 season.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The trustees review the level of the charity's reserves annually to ensure that the charity can continue to meet its objectives. The activities that the charity undertakes on a day-to-day basis are funded from restricted reserves where the specific activity meets the restriction placed on a fund and unrestricted reserves for all other activities. At 31 March 2019 the charity had unrestricted reserves of £17,222 (2018 £15,505) and restricted reserves of £37,255 (2018 £46,507). Taking into account the nature of the charity's income streams, the trustees are of the view that reserves at these levels are sufficient.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity's governing document is its constitution, which follows the CIO - Association Model and was registered with the Charity Commission on 14 April 2015.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Trustee vacancies are circulated 3-4 months before the AGM (held in June each year) amongst all our member clubs with a full description of the role including responsibilities.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
