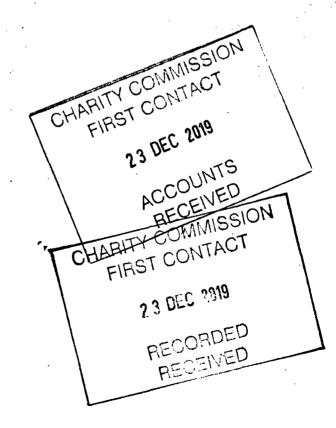

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## Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

### OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES Objectives and aims

The main aims and objectives of YCA are as follows:-

- To develop a community based organisation that serves the needs and aspirations of the Yemeni population and the wider community in Sandwell
- · Developing a cultural identity for youth
- Providing advice and information
- · Providing a point of reference and access for other groups within Sandwell

The YCA provides services and activities to the community in the following areas:-

- Education and Training
- Social Welfare
- Health Development
- Youth Development
- Cultural Activities

### Public benefit

The charity is a public benefit entity and the trustees confirm that they have referred to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charities aims and objectives. Main activities undertaken during the year contribute to the charity's purpose for the public benefit.

### Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2019

#### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Charitable activities

Management Committee members meet bi monthly to review the performance of the organisation's staff and the projects that they are running as well as ensuring that the organisation is continuing to be run on a financially secure basis.

In the last 12 months there has been a slight reduction in income generated for the organisation through the Greets Green Access Centre's room hire facilities, however, additional measures have been put in place aiming to increase number of customers and we will continue to monitor this very closely. Additionally we are glad to report that our present customers continue to express how user friendly and welcoming the Centre is, which has resulted in rebooking's and a loyal customer base being built. We just need to reach out to new potential customers.

Though Lodge Road Community Centre continues to bring client bookings and is self-sustainable, the lack of available parking continues to make it difficult to increase day-time bookings. We are investing in gradually getting the center refurbished which we will continue over the coming year aiming to attract more local groups to hire the Centre to fill these day time gaps.

It is pleasing to see that core activities for senior citizens, the young and other members of the community including welfare rights and advice, information and guidane continues to offer valuable services to an ever expanding

community. These services are not only stretching to meet the increasing needs of our established communities but also now increasingly meeting the needs of new and emerging migrants mainly those coming from the Middle East and Africa. However we are under no illusion these additional demands without additional resources are putting a lot of strain on current services, meaning the organisation needs to explore how to obtain additional funding resources to meet these needs.

Sadly the ARAB project has come to an end after a very successful delivery outcome with over achievement in all outputs. However it is also pleasing that as a result the organisation has managed to secure future funding to continue building on these successes.

The orgainisation is only as good as the team of dedicated staff and most of all our army of volunteers that are always ready to help run activities with us. I would like to express my sincere gratitude to them all as they are the unsung heroes and the backbone to a successful voluntary community organisation.

Finally the coming year is going to be very busy and I anticipate also challenging, but I am confident that with the support and dedication of our excellent staff, volunteers and funding partners we will be able to navigate and overcome these challenges together.

## FINANCIAL REVIEW

### Financial position

Overall, YCA has raised funds totalling £246,118 with the expenditure for the year totalling £261,814 leaving the organisation with a deficit of £15,696. This leaves £927,220 in our funds to be carried forward at 31 March 2019.

Our plans for the future will be to try and maintain the level of services we have via funding applications and are currently trying to source funding for a full time worker for the YCA Cultural Centre.

One long term future plan we have is to try and raise funds to purchase the lease of the YCA and land adjacent to the centre from SMBC to increase parking availability. Negotiations have started, however it could be 3-5 years before this becomes reality.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW Reserves policy

The Trustees have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets ('the free reserves') held by the charity should be approximately six months of the resources expended.

### **Funding Policy**

YCA is committed to sustainable development and management practices to support and enhance our activities and ideas in all areas of our organisation. We ensure fund management is an integral part of our decision making processes. To achieve this policy, we adopt a structured management approach to minimise adverse outcomes in all our activities.

## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

## **Governing document**

The Yemeni Community Association was first established in 1997 and on 12 August 1998 became a registered charity and held its first elections to nominate the YCA Management Committee. On 9 February 2006 the Association incorporated and became Yemeni Community Association in Sandwell Limited (YCA). On 1 April 2006, operations commenced through the Limited Company.

The Charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

### **Recruitment and appointment of new trustees**

YCA continuously strives to identify suitably skilled and experienced people from all communities. Trustees are appointed or reappointed at the Annual General Meeting in accordance with the Articles of Association.

### Organisational structure

The YCA constitution provides for a minimum of four and a maximum of nine Management Committee members, these members being elected at the annual general meeting by YCA members. In addition, the Management Committee may appoint an additional two co-opted members; however, these have no voting rights on the Committee.

### Key management remuneration

No remuneration directly or indirectly, out of the funds, was paid or is payable for the year to any Management Committee member or to any person or persons known to be connected with any of them.

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## Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2019

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland in the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Expenditure

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Leasehold property

The Charity purchased Greets Green Access Centre for £240,000 during the year ended 31 March 2004 which was wholly funded by a restricted fund grant from Sandwell MBC. The land on which the Centre stands is the subject of an 85 year lease from Sandwell MBC. On this basis the buildings are being written off on a straight line basis over 85 years.

Any renovation work on the YCA Cultural Centre will be depreciated over the remaining lease period from the point in time the work is completed.

#### Fixtures and fittings

Depreciation is provided at 20% straight line in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

#### **Operating lease rentals**

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

#### Financial instruments

The company has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments. Financial instruments are recognised when the Charitable Company becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Financial assets are offset, with the net amounts presented in the accounts when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

#### **Basic financial assets**

Basic financial assets, which include trade and other receivables and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest.

#### Basic financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including trade and other payables, are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.

Trade payables are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of operations from suppliers. Accounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade payables are recognised initially at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

#### **Derecognition of financial liabilities**

Financial liabilities are derecognised when the company's contractual obligations expire or are discharged or cancelled.

#### Sandwell MBC - Advice Worker

Grant for the employment for an Advice worker.

#### Sandwell MBC - Luncheon Club

Grant to provide access points for elderly men and women within the community.

#### Sandwell MBC - Summer Play Scheme

Funding towards the running of the Summer Play Scheme held at YCA for local children.

#### The Big Lottery - ARAB

Grant received towards a five year project aiming to raise the aspiration and confidence of the Arabian Community within Sandwell.

#### Sandwell MBC - Property Grant

The Charity purchased Greets Green Access Centre for £240,000 during the year ended 31 March 2004 which was wholly funded by a restricted fund grant from Sandwell MBC.

#### Mother Tongue
