Our young people have developed skills appropriate to their ages covering everything from first aid to camping. We have also supported the local community by helping at local fundraising events such as the annual Duck Race, firework display and church fundraising events, raising money for other charities as well as our scout group

All our leaders and helpers are volunteers who give their own time and enthusiasm to help the young people. They also gain valuable personal development such as teamworking skills, confidence and leadership skills.

We have an all-inclusive approach, encouraging everyone to join us, and their smiles and laughter after an activity or scout camp together are infectious!

Part of our ethos is to include other smaller scout groups in our community in camping expeditions. These groups are too small to have an extensive range of camping equipment, so rely on our equipment to be able to offer their scouts the chance to join in.

We had three very successful camps with more young people joining us for the camps than we have had on previous occasions. I must thank both the leaders who were involved in the planning and execution of a varied and exciting program for all camps, but also the parents who worked tirelessly and really helped to make the camps such a success.

Our group numbers from each section go from strength to strength with more young people joining us. Even though we have an excellent set of Leaders, with increased numbers we can always use, and really need, additional Leaders/helpers to improve and expand the experience which we can provide to our Beavers, Cubs, Scouts and Explorers.

We also had two of our explorers go off to the World Scout Jamboree and they have come back with some amazing stories and tales of what proved to not only be a once in a lifetime opportunity, but also a chance to make new friends and experience something completely unique that no other organisation can offer.

Some of our young people's achievements since September 2018:

Beaver Section 182 badges awarded, 2 of which were Chief Scouts Bronze

Cubs Section 405 badges awarded, 4 of which were Chief Scouts Silver

Scout Section: 317 badges awarded, we had no Chief Scouts Gold awarded however we have several young people who are well on their way to this achievement

Explorer Section: 75 badges awarded, 1 of which was Chief Scouts Platinum. 1 Duke of Edinburgh Silver and one Young Leader Belt

As you can see our young people are working hard to gain their awards and we have quite a few who have gone on to achieve the top award. Looking at the records we are due to celebrate quite a few more successes in the coming year.
