# Recording of 'The Fish that became the Sun' by English composer Frank Denyer

*The Fish that became the Sun* is a major work of late 20<sup>th</sup> Century British music written in 1994, but never performed or recorded. The work for 37 musicians involves many rare instruments from all over the world in diverse combinations. This world premiere recording is an important document which enables a reappraisal of this significant voice in British contemporary music.

#### Student workshops at the University of Kent

A trio of musicians provided a valuable educational opportunity for 15 undergraduate student composers, workshopping, performing and recording their compositions. The ensemble made three visits to the university across the academic year: an introductory recital and discussion, composition workshops, and a final recital/live recording session.

#### Way Out East - Composer Portraits: Frank Denyer (June 2018) and Rolf Hind (September 2018)

These concerts formed part of a residency at the Coronet Theatre, Notting Hill, during 2018. This brought contemporary classical music to new audiences (over 300 people across the series) in a venue normally associated with theatrical productions. Each concert involved opportunities for the audience to engage with the composers and performers through pre-concert talks and informal post-concert receptions. By focussing on individual composers these programmes enhanced and deepened public understanding and appreciation of these distinctive compositional voices. Promotional materials (such as podcasts) and documentary films made at the events helped to further facilitate the long-term impact of these events.
