<u>Structure</u>

The board of trustees has a chair, and trustees. The CEO reports to the trustees at each meeting, and the chair and CEO have regular meetings to discuss progress.

The board has four meetings per year, at which time all aspects of the operations and mission of the charity are discussed. It recruits trustees from word of mouth, posts on social media (LinkedIn, twitter), as well as using job boards of local and national organisations that are set up to support Community Interest Companies and charities.

Activities and Objectives for the year

The Juno Project works with vulnerable teenage girls who have been, or are at risk of being, excluded from school or becoming not in education, employment or training (NEET); and/or have severe anxiety. We have developed a bespoke programme, This Is Me (TIM), delivered by facilitators who have experienced similar challenges, which helps the girls to improve their self-esteem and confidence, and to continue in education in order to achieve their personal goals.

At the beginning of January, the trustees set a challenging target of delivering the This Is Me programme to 100 girls, predominantly in a range of schools across Sussex.

Achievement and Performance

The Juno Project worked with 62 girls this year. Whilst this wasn't the 100 we had hoped to support this, nonetheless, represented a large increase on the five in the 2016/17 pilot.

We worked in 12 schools, across 3 counties (West Sussex, East Sussex, and Croydon), and delivered over 200 sessions.

In terms of impact, all of the girls stayed in school and/or went on to college and/or an apprenticeship, or work. 92% said that they believed their confidence had improved, and all of the girls showed a difference in the way they saw themselves at the end of the programme, compared to their statements at the beginning.

In addition, 30% stated that they had changed their friendship groups in order to surround themselves with more supportive and/or positive people.

When asked what they would say to other girls who might be coming onto the TIM programme next academic year, comments included:

'Take the opportunity – it's a once in a lifetime chance!'

'Do it! I wasn't going to at first but I'm glad I did: you aren't alone, people are here for you'

'Do it, you will gain so much confidence'

When teachers were asked what changes they saw in the girls, feedback included:

Increased attendance and punctuality

A reduction in risk-taking behaviours

An increased ability to manage emotional outbursts

An improvement in their outlook on the future

Having the benefit of being a year in to the TIM programme, we can also report on the five girls from last year's pilot. Two went to college; one of whom, having battled many personal and school challenges, has a 100% attendance record, high grades, and plans to take another qualification. Two are in work, one of whom has plans to take a qualification on day release, and one dropped out from college after two months due to home pressures.

In terms of a more general benefit to the public, given that the girls see themselves, and their futures, in a much more positive light and are less inclined to stay friends with those who may be a disruptive influence, and teachers state a marked change in behaviours and outlook, we are confident that this will see a knock-on effect to those who may previously have experienced challenges with some of the girls within their family, and local community.
