### Trustees' Report

For the year ending 31 March 2019

#### **Objective**

The objectives of British Somali Community are to support and develop educational achievements, cultural and recreational interests of Somali children and young people, to assist in health improvements, of Somali women, as well as to provide education and training facilities for Somali women to enable them to participate as active citizens.

#### Legal structure

BRITISH SOMALI COMMUNITY is a registered charity and a company limited by guarantee and is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 18 December 2002.

#### Financial statements

The trustees, who are also directors of the charitable company, submit their trustees' report and financial statements for the year ending 31 March 2019.

#### Policies:

### Reserve policy:

The charity currently operates with reserve account balances of £30,000. The trustees are endeavouring to build up its donor base with a view to having sufficient reserves.

### Risk(s) review:

The trustees have recently reviewed the major risks faced by the charity. This has resulted in efforts to increase charity's donor base.

#### Trustees Responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006.

The trustees oversee preparation of financial statements, select suitable accounting policies and make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent to give the true state of affairs of the charity.

Trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity. They are elected and replaced as set out in the Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Trustees' Report (continued)

Activities and Achievements

The charity is managed by 7 woman elected women trustee members, and currently is staffed by 6 part-time employee as well as 35 regular volunteers. Due to the Council funding cuts from December the Charity's service provision has to face challenges and office opening hours have changed to Monday – Wednesday - between 9.00am and 5.00 pm, but the charity's weekend work on family and children has been restored thanks to John Lyons Charity and BBC children in Need and LB Camden.

The core of the charity's work continues to be in the field of providing educational and recreational activities for young people and parents as well as providing multi-agency support services to families, health awareness and seminars empowering women to build confidence and strong voice to speak out for issues including Female Genital Mutilation (FGM); Domestic Violence and Mental Health; as well as advice and advocacy in the areas of education, social service training, employment, police and criminal justice. A newly Youth Safety project funded by LB Camden Task Force was set up in mid this year to support families against the disproportionate youth knife crime in the Somali Community in Camden.

Supplementary School – Core project which growing and developing over 25 years and is shifting from the historical users from children from Somali Community only to be a multi- ethnic Communities school due to the growing number of its admission from children from diverse communities (Bengali, Arabic, East and Horn Africa). The school runs currently on Saturdays at BSC new Centre which is in the heart of Camden that attracted many families . The school activities expanded to work in partnership with local primary and secondary schools in areas of working with parents through un achievement, behaviour and learning difficulties , truancy and other support parents from the community may need . There's a plan to expand it due oversubscription and waiting list as well as the increasingly need of the disadvantaged young people's education attainement and engagement ,

Family Support Project - a valuable service covering most activities as Esol and Sewing classes; 1to1 advise; Parents seminars, workshops and multi agencies working to enable parents and families access statutory and voluntary service. It has made great impact on families support needs though cuts Since 2016 by LB Camden has affected.

Empowering women & girls Project -. Exciting program running for the 2nd year aimed to equip Women to have a voice, build confidence, knowledge and experience for leadership and discuss and support concerned women and girls issues.

Youth Safety Partnership Parent Support Program funded by L B Camden covers range of activities addressing parent's needs for issues related to their children and young people in areas of youth disorder and drug alcohol and knife crime. Also supporting their education achievement and employment

Women Health – Drop in – Health activities designed to cater women's health needs through stress-free environment as physical exercise, health wellbeing, Partnership Mental Health peer support sessions and health eating, Henna and massage & beauty.

#### Funding

The trustees express their thanks to all funding agencies and individuals that have helped the charity to develop and provide its crucial services for the local community. Special thanks go to the following agencies that supported the charity during this financial year: London Borough of Camden, John Lyon's Charity; Trust of London; BBC Children In Need, LB Camden and those not listed here who have contributed and supported to the work of the charity in kind or by financial assistance.

### 1 Accounting Policies

### 1.1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, *Accounting and Reporting by Charities* (Revised SORP 2005) and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities.

### 1.2 Incoming Resources

Grants and donations are recognised on accruals

basis. Incoming resources are reported gross.

### 1.3 Resources Expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on accruals basis, inclusive of any VAT that cannot be recovered.

Expenditure that is directly attributable to specific activities has been included in these cost categories. Where costs are attributable to more than one activity, they have been apportioned across the cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of those resources.

### 1.4 Depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation.

Provision for depreciation of tangible fixed assets held by the charity is made at an annual rate of 25% on straight line basis.
