REPORT OF THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

The PCC has pleasure in submitting the Report and Accounts for the year ended 31 December 2019.

Objects of the charity

The charity is responsible for co-operating with the incumbent, in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish, the whole mission of the Church be it pastoral, evangelistic, social or ecumenical. The PCC is also responsible for maintaining certain church property situated within the parish, namely St Luke's Church Centre and Flats 1-3 Fernhead Road, London W9 3EH.

Summary of the charity's main activities and achievements

To further the above objects and vision, the charity's main activities and achievements were as follows:

- Supporting the employment of the children and families worker
- Enabling the placement of another volunteer for the year from the Berlin Mission
- Supporting the running of a holiday club during February half term
- Agreeing to the introduction of 'churchsuite' database program to enhance church administration
- Supporting the church's mission partners through financial contributions of approximately £15,000
- Maintaining the church centre, church flats and grounds through renewing of gutters, floors and some electrical wiring, and removal of japanese knotweed and a damaged tree.
- Supporting the Parish weekend away in September
- Supporting the North Westminster foodbank through regular collections and the Westminster night shelter.
- In addition the PCC continued to support St Luke's C of E Primary School through the appointment of school governors and providing church facilities for the school in worship, concerts, music, cooking and gardening, the summer fayre, as well as facilities for the school to work with parents.

Most of the charity's activites are undertaken by volunteers and the charity could not operate effectively without their efforts.

In planning the activities the PCC has applied the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission.

Financial review

During the year income increased by £4,597, to £180,832, and expenditure increased by £20,028, to £189,731. As a result the cash held by the charity decreased by £8,916, to £96,264, of which £42,491 is unrestricted and can be used for any charitable purpose.

Reserves policy

The PCC has determined that the charity should aim to hold unrestricted cash of no less than one quarter of a year's total expenditure so that the charity could continue to operate should income and/or expenditure vary adversely. On 2019 expenditure this Reserves target is £47,433. At the year end, the charity held unrestricted cash of £42,491. Following four years of above target reserves this is £4,942 short of the reserves target. The PCC is taking action with the aim of meeting the reserves target. This includes a review of day to day expenditure to identify savings, reviewing and increasing Lettings rates, and taking an active approach to encourage church members to review and increase their giving. In addition the PCC aims to hold £40,000 in a designated fund at the end of each year to support the employment of a Children & Families worker over the following two years. This target has been met.

Governance

The charity is registered with the Charity Commission and operates under the Charities Act 2011. The governing documents for the charity are the Parochial Church Councils (Powers) Measure 1956 (as amended) and the Church Representation Rules 2011.

The appointment of PCC members is governed by, and set out in, the Church Representation Rules. The PCC comprises ex-officio members (which includes clergy and churchwardens), elected members and co-opted members. The PCC organises elections annually before the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) to fill vacancies. The members of the PCC are the charity's trustees for the purposes of charity law.

Responsibility for setting policy and for determining the parameters within which the charity should operate rests with the PCC which meets regularly to monitor the activities of the charity. Responsibility for the day to day operation of the charity has been delegated to a team led by the incumbent.

The PCC has complied with the duty under section 5 of the Safeguarding and Clergy Discipline Measure 2016 (which sets out the PCC's obligations to safeguard children and vulnerable adults).

Relationships with other charities and related parties

As part of the United Benefice the clergy members of the PCC, Alastair Thom, Jackie Barry and Emmie Walford, are also trustees of Emmanuel Church, 389E Harrow Road W9 3NA.

Responsibilities of trustees

Charity law requires the PCC to prepare financial statements for each accounting year which record the receipts and payments of the charity for the year.

The PCC is responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable us to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011.

We also have a responsibility to safeguard the assets of the charity and to take reasonable steps to prevent fraud or any other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

1 Accounting policies

The accounts have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis and comprise a statement that shows the charity's receipts and payments, a statement that summarises the charity's assets and liabilities and related notes. The accountancy profession have determined that only accounts prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards present a 'true and fair' view and, as these receipts and payments accounts have not (and cannot) be prepared in accordance with accounting standards, these accounts do not present (and are not intended to present) a 'true and fair' view of the charity's financial activities and state of affairs.

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the PCC in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity. Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the PCC for particular purposes. Restricted funds are donations which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors; they include donations received from appeals for specific activities or projects. Endowment funds are donations that are retained as capital in accordance with the donor's wishes. The nature of the restriction determines whether the endowments represent permanent endowments or expendable endowments.
