Report of the Treasurer on the Accounts of the Parochial Church Council for the year ended 31 December 2015

Pages 1 and 2 of the accounts follow a prescribed format. The remaining pages provide further detail which is probably more meaningful. Please note the explanation of the different types of fund on page 3, which is important to the understanding of the accounts.

Matters of significance to which I would like to draw attention are:

- Giving to the General Fund. Regular (Planned) giving by bank standing order and numbered weekly envelope declined by 1.1% in the last year to £112,951 as a consequence of some of our donors having died or moved away.
- The income from Hall through lettings was £21,730 which is a slight decline by £970. In the last months of the year we lost a regular hire and are looking for a replacement. In 2015 we stopped our annual transfer of £1,000 to HallFFER (Fixtures, Fittings and Equipment Renewals) as the Fund is currently well equipped for future maintenance. However, the Hall Fund ended with a surplus of £2,473 which was transferred to the General Fund.
- The Annual Share requested by the Diocese was £152,072. In 2015 we paid £102,000 which is an increase by £2,000 compared to 2013 and 2014.
- Gas and Electricity costs appear to have increased by a significant sum. This is partly the result of some payments in 2015 that still relate to 2014. There has also been a miscalculation of the VAT by our provider for which we will receive a refund in 2016.
- The PCC's Outward Giving is channelled through our Mission Fund, structured to enable us to reclaim Gift Aid tax on donations which we can pass on to the charities. In 2015 we were able to give a total of more than £11,600 to worthwhile causes at home and overseas.
- The cash and other assets are shown on page 2. Working balances are held at Barclays Bank. Other monies are on deposits with the C of E Central Board of Finance.
- Cash held in the Development Fund is largely earmarked for projects approved by the PCC. In 2015 we gratefully received some very generous donations for ongoing projects as the restoration of the reredos and new altar frontal designs.
- The revaluation of the investments in the Demaine Fund at the year-end resulted in an increase of £481 (page 1) reflecting the performance of the stock market in 2015.

ST MARGARET'S ILKLEY PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the year ended 31 December 2015

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 together with applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP 2005.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for the valuation of investment assets which are shown at market value. The financial statements include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which the PCC are responsible in law. They do not include the accounts of church groups that owe their main affiliation to another body, nor those that are informal gatherings of church members.

Funds

Endowment Funds are funds, the capital of which must be maintained; only income arising from investment of the endowment may be used either as restricted or unrestricted funds depending upon the purpose for which the endowment was established.

Restricted Funds represent (a) income from trusts or endowments which may be expended only on those restricted objects provided in the terms of the trust or bequest, and (b) donations or grants received for a specific object or invited by the PCC for a specific object. The funds may only be expended on the specific object for which they were given. Any balance remaining unspent at the end of the year must be carried forward as a balance on that fund.

Unrestricted Funds are general funds which can be used for PCC ordinary purposes. To assist administration, unrestricted funds can be *Designated* for a particular purpose but they remain legally unrestricted.

The PCC does not necessarily invest separately for each fund. Where there is no separate investment, interest is apportioned to each fund on an average balance basis.

Incoming resources

Planned giving, collections and donations are recognised when received. Tax refunds are recognised when the incoming resource to which they relate is received. Grants and legacies are accounted for when the PCC is legally entitled to the amounts due. Dividends are accounted for when received, interest is accrued. All other income is recognised when receivable. All incoming resources are accounted for gross.

Resources used

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over, or when awarded if that award creates a binding obligation on the PCC. The diocesan share is accounted for when paid. All other expenditure is generally recognised when it is incurred and is accounted for gross.

Fixed assets

Consecrated property and movable church furnishings

Consecrated and beneficed property of any kind is excluded from the financial statements by s.96(2)(a) of the Charities Act 1993.

Movable church furnishings held by the vicar and churchwardens on special trusts for the PCC and which require a faculty for disposal are accounted for as inalienable property. They are listed in the church's inventory which can be inspected (at any reasonable time). For anything acquired prior to 2000 there is insufficient cost information available and therefore such assets are not valued in the financial statements. The policy is to write-off when acquired the cost of equipment used within the church when such items have cost no more than £3,000. Items costing more than this are depreciated on a straight-line basis over 4 years.

Investments are valued at market value at 31 December

PCC Secretary's Report for 2016 APCM

The PCC has met eight times during the year, to March 31st 2016 and here are some highlights:

Mission Action Plan

MAP 3: With the three main areas of focus for the church – the Reredos, new chairs, repair to the floor – previously agreed, work has progressed as follows: The cleaning of the Reredos was successfully completed and to a very high standard. A sample of chair options, loaned to us by St. Giles, Pontefract, were put in church, and a consultation was made with the congregation to gather their thoughts on the issue of replacing the chairs, using a survey. Having conducted the chair consultation, there was a clear sense that people did not feel that the chairs presented were value for money and it was decided to place the purchasing of new chairs on hold. The CFC has sourced suppliers and quotes to repair the floor – both the wooden blocks and tiles. The next stage is to make recommendations to the PCC on how to proceed. This is outlined further in the CFC report.

Outward Giving: The group has been very active during the year, supporting causes both and home and abroad. In 2015 we gave more than £11,600 to worthwhile causes. See separate report.

Stewardship: There has been an overall increase in our planned giving. Unfortunately we did lose a number of our major donors during the year, with members of the congregation moving away or dying. See separate report.

A JustGiving account has been installed on the St Margaret's website to enable donations to be made both on a casual and regular basis, and using the GiftAid option. This may also help with future campaigns, such as fundraising for the floor.

Young People's Music Scholarships

In order to help secure St Margaret's strong musical offering for the future, two new initiatives were introduced. Tammas Slater, a 14 year old pupil from Guiseley, who studies at Cheathams Boarding School of Music, was appointed as our first *Organ Scholar*. Tammas plays once a week for a minimum of 36 weeks per year and is showing huge potential.

Following this success, a *Choral Scholars initiative* was introduced. We now have nine Choral Scholars, who are required to sing 30 weeks per year. They have made an excellent start.

Parish Hall

There was a slight downturn in income in hall lettings during the year, which was due to the loss of one user. However, the Hall Fund ended 2015 with a surplus of funds, which was transferred to the General Fund.

A defibrillator was purchased thanks to a donor and installed at the bottom of the steps to the Parish Hall.

Appointments

At the meeting of the Synods in the Bradford Episcopal Area in July, it was agreed to defer the decision about the future shape of the Deaneries potentially by up to two years, until budgets and areas of authority have been agreed. Fr Philip therefore continues as Area Dean for potentially up to two years.

As Cllr Mike Gibbons completed his year as Lord Mayor on May 19th, Fr Philip's ministry as Lord Mayor's Chaplain also came to an end.

Catherine Webster was elected as PCC Secretary, and therefore joined the Standing Committee.

John Sunderland was elected Churchwarden, and Jane Sheldon became acting Churchwarden.

Steve Betts was elected Chair of the Finance and Hall committees.

Olaf Beyersdorff was elected Treasurer.

Catherine Beaumont volunteered to act as Disability Officer.

Alison Williams and Geoff Cloke took over the running of Cant and Dec following Sue Gray's retirement from the role.

Treasury

The Finance Committee continue to exercise strong control over the finances of the parish and, as can be seen from the Annual Accounts (separate document), the finances are in a healthy state.

APCM

We enter the new year with one or two challenges but with the confidence that we have the strength, time and talents to meet them.

Quinquennial Survey

A Quinquennial Survey was undertaken by our church architect, Mike Overton, in August 2015. A variety of minor issues were highlighted and prioritised throughout the period of the Quinquennium. However, our detailed attention has been drawn to the deteriorating condition of the nave floor and its potential to cause a significant trip hazard particularly around the heavily used area in the south east corner. The CFC's response to this section of the report is more detailed below under MAP3.

In addition, we did experience some leaks in the roof which have all been attended to following Mr Crighton's regular autumn visit. Mr Crighton has also recommended some additional lead work on a 'belt and braces' basis, but at an additional cost of £6,852 plus VAT. This is to install an additional lead covering along the full length of each ridge. This is an extensive piece of work, but not one which is of immediate priority. This aspect will be kept under review during the period of the current Quinquennium.

Our first priority following the second Parish Presentation held in July 2014, was for the cleaning and conservation of the reredos. This task has now been completed by Mr Matthew Beesley of Gem Conservation Ltd from Northampton. Mr Beesley has completed this work with great skill, professionalism and dedication. We look forward to revealing the full beauty of this work following Easter Eve.

Mr Beesley has subsequently provided prices for a similar level of craftsmanship for cleaning the statue of Our Lady including the canopy, statue and plinth together with the high level woodwork over the baptistery, the rood screen and high level woodwork around the Lady Chapel and organ loft. Mr Beesley's prices are considered to be most reasonable and this work will be undertaken subject to funding and dependent upon other works which may be undertaken in respect of the nave floor. As reported last year, the poor condition of the nave floor has been highlighted for some time and reiterated as an increasingly significant trip hazard in the current Quinquennial report. During the last 12 months, 5

specialist and individual contractors have been to visit church and an intrusive inspection has been undertaken beneath sample areas of oak block flooring and beneath the concrete pad located nearest to the piano.

Following an 'away day' undertaken by John Sunderland and David Chary to Staffordshire, it has been ascertained that reclaimed tiles of the same manufacture are available for a patch and mend type solution which was first considered. However, this approach has been overtaken by a welcome visit by Mr John Paton from Ruabon near Wrexham. Mr Paton is the current owner of the company who manufactured our original tiles in 1879. He has subsequently given us a quotation for renewing all the tiles throughout the nave which in conjunction with a separate quotation for relaying and sealing the oak blocks is now under active consideration, subject to funding and DAC approval.

Heating Facilities

The winter of 2015/16 has again been relatively mild and our systems have worked well. Both central heating systems are serviced annually.

Arboreal and Garden Matters

At the beginning of the growing season in 2015, we parted company with our previous gardening contractor and we have engaged a more local contractor from Addingham, Mr Jez Parker, who is continuing to maintain our grassed areas on a regular basis.

Church Cleaning

A number of long serving silver cleaners have retired or deceased and we therefore seek to reenergise this area of responsibility. New altar cloths have been acquired which ease the burden of laundering.

Vestment Storage

This issue continues to be reviewed but will be a major undertaking in due course and will be considered only after other, more significant priorities have been undertaken.

Lady Chapel Altar Frontal

An additional frontal has been commissioned and is currently subject to a DAC Faculty Application.

Finally, I express my very grateful thanks to all members of the CFC, Alan Raw, our caretaker, our contractors who have worked diligently throughout 2015/16, and to all members of the congregation who have given their time freely and joyfully for the glory of our church.

St Margaret's Outward Giving Group & Mission Fund

Report to the APCM, April 2016

In 2015, the Mission Fund disbursed approximately £11,527 (against a budget of £7,100), as follows:

There were three surpluses: £221 for Hand-in-Hand/JJ Nshumi School, £138 for Christian Aid and £2,039 Unallocated. These have been retained for distribution in 2016.

In addition, £2,825 raised was paid direct and did not appear in the Mission Fund, including £55 for US, £110 for Bradford Nightstop, £1,026 for The Children's Society and £1,634 for Christian Aid Week. This brought total charitable giving in 2015 to over £14,300.

The Mission Fund is overseen by the Outward Giving Group whose members are Catherine Beaumont, Fr Philip Gray, Arnold Kuchartschuk (Christian Aid), Michelle Still (Fair Trade and The Children's Society), Alison Stretton and Linda Whittaker (US). We meet three times a year, provide recommendations to the PCC and organise displays and speakers for the chosen charities. We are very grateful for the support given by the congregation to the appeals and fundraising initiatives over the course of each year and are happy to discuss the organisations we recommend or to receive suggestions of organisations for future support. Information about the charities to be supported in 2016 will be provided in a separate leaflet available at the APCM.

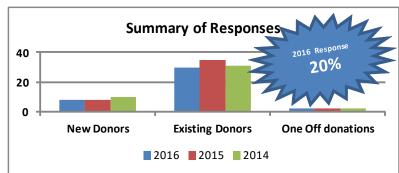
2016 Stewardship Renewal

Summary

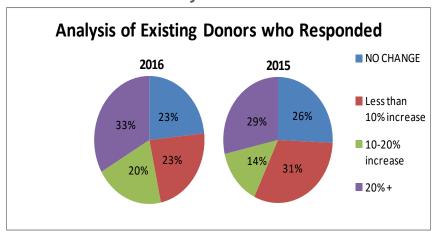
As at March 2016 a total of 40 responses have been received. This is 5 less than in 2015, however the timing of this year's update is earlier. The 2016 response rate is similar to that of previous years and means that only 1 members of our congregation are choosing to respond.

Of the 40 responses, 30 are from existing donors; 8 are from new donors and 2 are one-off donations.

Our income in 2015 from Planned Giving was -1% less than our income in 2014 and -5% behind our 2015 budget of £109,000. Our Planned Giving Budget remains the same in 2016, therefore in order to meet this we will need to increase our monthly income by at least £600. Our 8 new donors and 2 one off donations with Gift Aid will give us an additional £594 per month. Our 30 existing donors have pledged to increase their donations including Gift Aid by £399 per month. This is a total of £993 increase per month. Thank you
